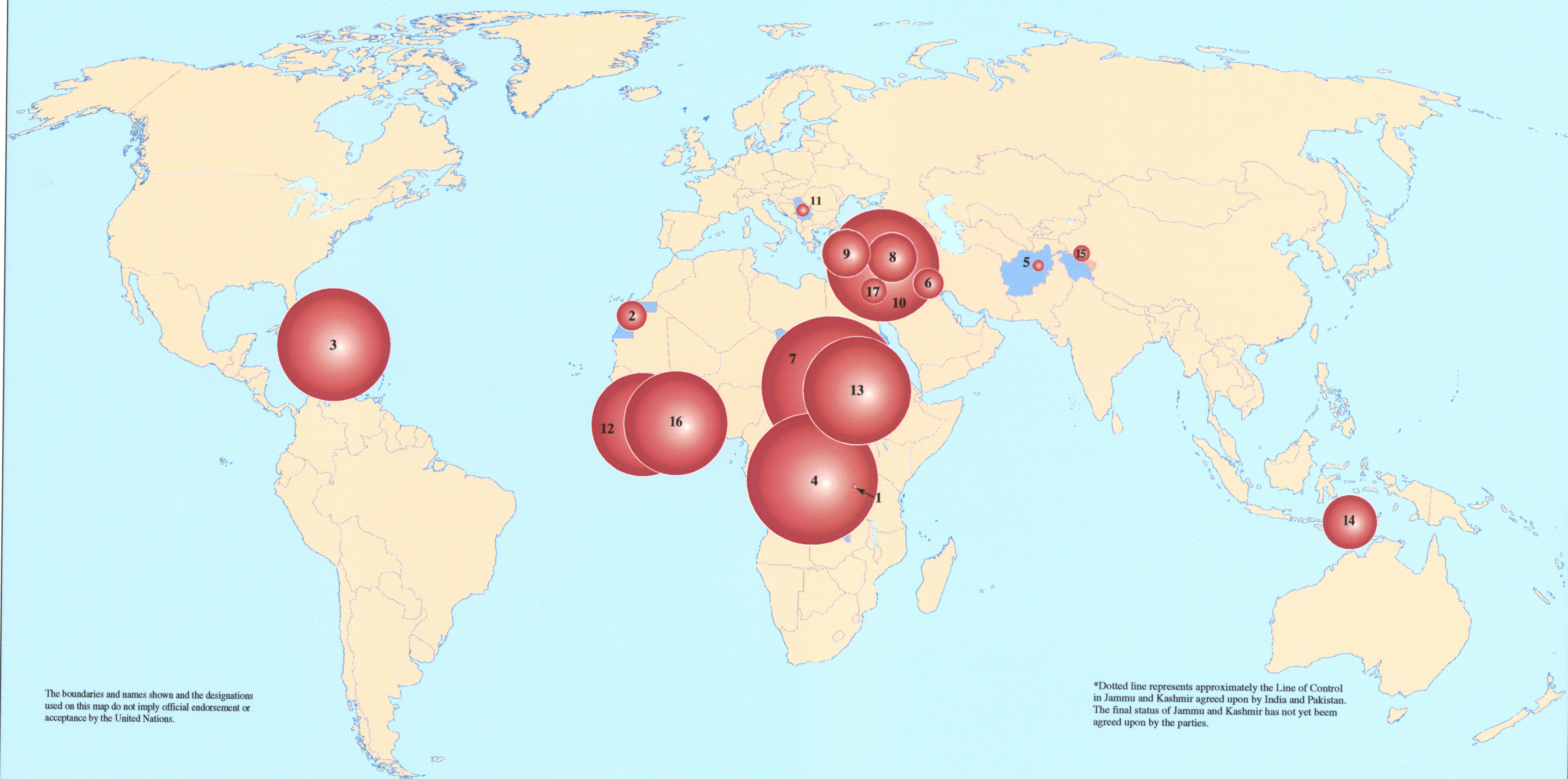


# Troop and Police Deployment in United Nations Missions as of 30 April 2011\*
