Introduction

1. The objective of the Catalogue on Gender Statistics Activities is to present a compilation of gender-related activities and outputs implemented at the country level. The Catalogue aims to promote best practices from a wide range of experiences. It also provides useful information for planning future capacity building activities needed at the regional level. However the Catalogue may provide an incentive to carry further work on gender statistics at the national level. In addition it provides information on the development stage of gender statistics for international comparison.
2. The Catalogue derives its information from Arab countries. It is divided into two parts; the first part provides an assessment of exerted efforts made by each country highlighting their comparative experience or the lack of it in different types of activities and outputs. The second part provides a country list of activities and outputs with a synopsis on each, where available.
3. The compiled activities and outputs are mainly in the field of official gender statistics published by the national statistical offices, and other national partners; such as women machineries.
4. Activities and outputs are spread over nine categories, they are:
 - **Gender Statistics Publications**
Statistics publications that highlight in comparative analysis the situation of women and men in the Arab region.
 - **Gender-Focused Publications**
Analytical publications published by the national statistical offices, that focus on gender issues in different sectors such as women and men in economy, women in decision making, women in education etc.
 - **Handbooks**
Methodological publications that provide users with the know-how related to collection and compilation of gender statistics.
 - **Gender-Based Surveys**
Gender related surveys and specialized modules to measure gender issues such as Time Use Statistics, Violence against Women, etc.
 - **Gender Databases**
Gender databases compiled specifically on women and men, girls and boys, in different socio-economic areas.
 - **Capacity Building Workshops**
Workshops, meetings and conferences set forth by the Arab countries to sensitize national users on gender issues, to educate, promote and discuss areas of concern in the region.
 - **Technical Materials**
Wall charts, flyers, advocacy materials, etc related to gender statistics
 - **Gender on Websites**
Women Machinery or National Statistical Offices disseminating national gender-related statistics, activities and outputs.

- **Related Reports on Women**

Publications, surveys and reports put together by women machinery and relating to women status in relation to the Beijing Platform of Action and Convention on the Elimination of Women.

5. Arab countries are at different stages of development of their gender Statistics Programs. Some countries have well- established Gender Units (Jordan, Iraq and Palestine) or have designated focal points in their national statistical offices. Other countries are implementing gender activities on ad hoc basis and are at an early stage of developing their national Gender Statistics Programs.

6. Almost all the countries have published Gender Statistics Publications on Women and Men (80%). Gender-Focused Publications are, however, published to a lesser extent (31%), as well as the methodological Handbooks (41%). Gender-Based Surveys/Modules (31%) are conducted to a lesser extent along with Technical Materials (36%).

7. The least implemented activities and outputs at the national level are: Gender Databases (9%); the National Capacity Building Workshops (9%); and disseminating information on gender on the national Websites (18%).



II. DISCUSSION POINTS
