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## CONSIDERATION OF EFFECTIVE MEASURES TO ENHANCE THE: PROTECTION, SECURITY AND SAFETY OF DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR MISSIONS AND REPRESENTATIVES

### Report of the Secretary-General

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## 1. INTRODUCTION

1. On 3 December 1986, the General Assembly adopted resolution 41/78, entitled "Consideration of effective measures to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives". Paragraphs 2 to 15 of the resolution read as follows:

"The General Assembly,

"...

"2. Strongly condemns acts of violence against diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, as well as against missions and representatives to international intergovernmental organizations and officials of such organizations, and emphasizes that such acts can never be justified!

"3. Emphasizes the importance of enhanced awareness throughout the world of the necessity of ensuring the protection, security and safety of such missions, representatives and officials, as well as of the role of the United Nations in this regard;

"4. Urges States to observe and to implement the principles and rules of international law governing diplomatic and consular relations and, in particular, to take all necessary measures in conformity with their international obligations to ensure effectively the protection, security and safety of all diplomatic and consular missions and representatives officially present in territory under their jurisdiction, including practicable measures to prohibit in their territories illegal activities of persons, groups and organizations that encourage, instigate, organize or engage in the perpetration of acts against the security and safety of such missions and representatives;

"5. Calls upon States to take all necessary measures at the national and international levels to prevent any acts of violence against diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, as well as against missions and representatives to international intergovernmental organizations and officials of such organizations, and, in accordance with national law and international treaties, to prosecute or extradite those who perpetrate such acts;

"6. Recommends that States should co-operate closely through, inter alia, contacts between the diplomatic and consular missions and the receiving State, with regard to practical measures designed to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives and with regard to exchange of information on their circumstances of all serious violations thereof;

"7. Calls upon States that have not yet done so to consider becoming parties to the instruments relevant to the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives;

"8. Calls upon States, in cases where a dispute arises in connection with a violation of the principles and rules of international law concerning the inviolability of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, to make use of the means for: peaceful settlement: of disputes, including the good offices of the Secretary-General;

"9. Requests:

"(a) All States to report to the Secretary-General as promptly as possible serious violations of the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, as well as missions and representatives with diplomatic status to international intergovernmental organizations;

"(b) The States in which the violation took place - and, to the extent possible, the State where the alleged offender is present - to report as promptly as possible on measures taken to bring the offender to justice and eventually to communicate, in accordance with its laws, the final outcome of the proceedings against the offender, and on measures adopted with a view to preventing a repetition of such violations;

"10. Requests the Secretary-General:

"(a) To circulate to all States, upon receipt, the reports received by him pursuant to paragraph 9 above, unless the reporting State requests otherwise;

"(b) To draw the attention, when appropriate, of the States directly concerned to the reporting procedures provided for in paragraph 9 above, when a serious violation has been reported pursuant to paragraph 9 (a) above;

"(c) To address reminders to States where such violations have occurred and have been reported, if no follow-up report has been made pursuant to paragraph 9 (b) above by such States within a reasonable period of time;

"(d) To send, in due time before the issuance of his yearly report on the present item, a circular note to all states requesting them to indicate whether they have any such violations, as referred to in paragraph 9 (a) above, to report for the preceding twelve months;

"11. Requests the Secretary-General to Prepare Guidelines embodying the relevant questions that States may wish to consider when reporting; the guidelines shall be circulated to all States with a view to strengthening the reporting Procedures provided for in paragraph 9 above;

"12. Also requests the Secretary-General to invite States to inform him of their views with respect to any measures needed to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives1

'13. Further requests the **Secretary-General** to submit to the **General Assembly** at its forty-second session a report **containing:**

**.(a)** Information on the state of **ratification of, and accessions to, the instruments** referred to in paragraph 7 **above;**

**.(b)** The reports received and views expressed pursuant to paragraphs 9 and 12 **above;**

"14. Invites the Secretary-General to submit to the **General Assembly** at its forty-second session **any views he may wish to express on the matters referred to in paragraphs 11 and 13 above)**

'15. Decides to include in the **provisional agenda of its forty-second session** the item entitled '**Consideration of effective measures to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives: report of the Secretary-General**'."

2. By note dated 10 June 1987, the Secretary-General, in accordance with paragraph 10 (d) of resolution 41/78, requested States to inform him whether they had any violations, as referred to in paragraph 9 (a) of the resolution, to report for the preceding 12 months, and invited them to communicate to him their views with respect to any measures needed to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives.

3. Section If A of the present report contains the reports submitted pursuant to paragraph 9 that had been received by 13 August 1987.

4. Any further communications received from States will be circulated in addenda to the present report.

5. In accordance with paragraph 13 of resolution 41/78, section 111 contains a report on the state of ratification of and accessions to the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of 1961, 1/ the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations of 1963 2/ and the respective optional protocols thereto, as well as the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of Crimes against Internationally Protected Persons, including Diplomatic Agents, of 1973. 3/

6. Pursuant to paragraph 11 of the same resolution, the Secretary-General circulated to all States, under cover of the note verbale referred to in paragraph 2 above, the guidelines embodying the relevant questions that States might wish to consider when reporting serious violations of the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, as well as of missions and representatives with diplomatic status to international intergovernmental organizations. For information purposes, the guidelines are reproduced in the annex to the present report.

## II. REPORTS AND VIEWS RECEIVED FROM STATES

### A. Reports received from States pursuant to paragraph 9 of General Assembly resolution 41/78

#### 1. Note verbale from the Permanent Mission of Belgium to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General 4/

[Original: French]

[20 July 1987]

The Permanent Mission of Belgium to the United Nations . . . has the honour, in pursuance of paragraph 9 of resolution 41/78 of 3 December 1986, to report . . . the following:

On 8 February 1987, an attack was made during the night on the premises of the Syrian Embassy in Brussels. Three homemade incendiary bombs caused only minor damage to the building in question. Responsibility for the incident has not been claimed.

The perpetrators are being sought among terrorist groups.

#### 2. Note verbale from the Permanent Mission of Denmark to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General 5/

[Original: English]

[ 25 June 1987]

The Permanent Mission of Denmark to the United Nations . . . has the honour, pursuant to paragraph 9 of General Assembly resolution 41/78, to transmit the following communication:

During the night of 13/14 September 1986, a bomb exploded outside the Soviet Embassy in Copenhagen. The explosion caused damage to property only. The bomb could not be characterized as a sophisticated device designed by professional terrorists.

Two persons who admitted having set off the explosion have been charged by the police with violation of the criminal code. Committal for trial is awaiting a statement by the Medico-Legal Council on their state of mind.

The case is considered to be fully cleared up.

3. Letter from the-permanent Representative of Ecuador to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

(Orignal: Spanish )

[30 June 1987]

I have the honour to **acknowledge** receipt of your **note LA/COD/4** dated 10 June 1987, **referring** to General Assembly resolution **41/78** of 3 December 1986, "**Consideration of effective measures to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives**", in which you indicate the need to comply with the **request** in paragraph 10 (d) for information on any violations of the protection, **security and safety of such diplomatic and consular missions and representatives** that have taken place in the past 12 months.

No incident of this nature has taken place in Ecuador. In any event, I am pleased to inform you that the matter is being appropriately studied by the Ecuadorian Government, and I shall be glad to bring its findings to your attention.

4. Note verbale from the Permanent Mission of Lesotho to the United Nations addressed to the Secretariat

(Orignal: English)

[30 June 1987]

We are pleased to inform the Secretariat that there have not been any violations of the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives in Lesotho during the period under review.

5. Note verbale from the Permanent Representative of the Netherlands to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General 6/

(Orignal: English)

(5 March 1987)

The Permanent Representative of the Kingdom of the Netherlands to the United Nations . . . has the honour, pursuant to paragraph 9 of General Assembly resolution 41/78, to report the following incident to the Secretary-General.

On the night of 25/26 December 1986, a passenger vehicle belonging to and parked close by the Embassy of the Soviet Union in The Hague was set on fire.

The person responsible was apprehended shortly after the offence took place. He stated that he had set fire to the car in order to protest the Soviet occupation of Afghanistan. He had acted entirely by himself. On 15 January 1987, the offender was fined f. 1,500 and sentenced to two months' conditional imprisonment by the police magistrate in The Hague.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs presented its apologies to the Embassy immediately after the incident.

6. Note verbale from the Permanent Mission of Turkey to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General 7/

[5 March 1987]

The Permanent Mission of Turkey to the United Nations ... has the honour to bring to the attention of the Secretary-General new information in connection with the report of the Secretary-General, circulated in document A/41/547/Add.3, on the "Consideration of effective measures to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives".

It has now been ascertained that among the individuals cited in said report, the citizenships of Sami Rashdi Ahmet Washan and Nader Hossanlem Habrouh were unknown and that they were born and resided in Burlej and Gaza respectively.

7. Note verbale from the Permanent Mission of Qatar to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the State of Qatar to the United Nations ... in reference to note LA/COD/4 of 10 June 1987, has the honour to report that no violation of the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives has occurred in the territory of the State of Qatar during the preceding 12 months.

8. Note verbale from the Permanent Representative of Mexico to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

[Original: Spanish]

[11 August 1987]

... During the past 12 months, no violation of the type specified in paragraph 9 (a) of the resolution has occurred. However, the diplomatic missions of Denmark, Finland and Italy were peacefully occupied by groups of farmers who withdrew from those missions promptly and peacefully once their requests were dealt with.



9. Note verbale from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of New Zealand to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

The Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of New Zealand wishes to advise the Secretary-General that New Zealand hae no violation8 of the kind referred to in paraqrph 9 ta) of the resolution to report for the 12 months preceding the date of this note.

10. Note verhale from the Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations, pursuant to paragraph 9 of General Assembly resolution 41/78 of 3 December 1986, and to article 11 of the Convention on the Prevention and Funiehment of Crimes against Internationally Protected Persons, including Diplomatic Aqents, has the honour, on behalf of the Government of Canada, to advise that there have been no Violent crimes against internationally protected persons, including diplomatic agents or diplomatic premises, dur inq the repot tinq period.

The Government of Canada unequivocally condemns acts of violence and will continue to combat all forma of terrorism in co-operation with all nations.

## ANNEX

Guidelines embodying the relevant questions that States may wish to consider when reporting serious violations of the probation, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, as well as of missions and representatives with diplomatic status to international intergovernmental organizations\*

1. Time, date and location of the reported violation.
2. Characteristics of the reported violation.
3. Mission(s) or representative(s) against whom the reported violation was directed.
4. Casualties sustained and damage caused by the reported violation.
5. Name, nationality, place of habitual or permanent residence of the alleged offender(s) and other available information regarding the identity of such offender(s).
6. Devices and means used for carrying out the reported violation.
7. Accomplices of the alleged offender(s).
8. Measures taken to apprehend and to bring the alleged offender to justice.
9. Final outcome of the proceedings against the offender.
10. Assistance of other States directly concerned in connection with the proceedings brought in respect of the offence(s) committed.
11. Measures adopted with a view to preventing a repetition of the reported violation.
12. Other relevant information.
