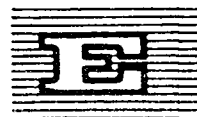

GUATEMALA

/In its reply, the Government of Guatemala reports various measures it took to improve the welfare of the people of Guatemala. For instance, in the period under review, a new Labour Code was drafted and steps were taken to improve living standards by combating inflation. The Government of Guatemala reports the following relevant measures: /

Regulations concerning uniform hours of work in the governmental service.

Resolution authorizing the establishment of a training course in work supervision, January 1971.

Resolution containing regulatory standards for the implementation of International Labour Conventions Nos. 45, 77, 78 and 89. (Resolution No. 28-73, 12 September 1973).

Governmental Resolution of 12 August 1971 concerning the National Commission of ISMOCAP (Institute of Occupational Safety and Medicine for Central America and Panama).

Congressional Decree No. 11-73 containing the Wage Law.

Wage Law for public administration. (Congressional Decree No. 11-73).

Act concerning the organization of the Technical Institute for Training and Productivity. (Congressional Decree No. 17-72).
