### INTRODUCTION

1. The present addendum contains an analysis of the reply received from the Government of the Socialist Republic of Romania after document E/CN.4/1168/Add.2 had been issued.

#### I. GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

2. In the opinion of the Government of Romania, fundamental human rights can be fully enjoyed, and peace and progress amongst all peoples of the world achieved, only by the total and definitive abolition of colonialism, neo-colonialism and racial discrimination. The world community has a duty to work towards this end and assist the United Nations in its major task to eliminate the afore-mentioned practices.

3. The Government of Romania believes that the United Nations should support in a systematic and continuous manner the efforts of States towards concrete measures which will guarantee fundamental human rights for all, the elimination of social inequalities and of all forms of racial discrimination, equal and effective rights to work, to education, to culture and to sharing the benefits of civilisation.

II. SUGGESTIONS OF A FUNCTIONAL OR PROCEDURAL NATURE

4. In the view of the Government of Romania, the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women should play a more active and substantive role in the solution of the political, economic and social problems of women and support the action by States to eliminate every form of inequality and discrimination against women and guarantee their equal participation in the social and national life.

5. Special attention, the Government of Romania believes, should be given to the aspirations of youth and their participation in economic and social activities in a spirit that will ensure peace and co-operation amongst all peoples. In this regard, the Government of Romania believes that a United Nations Council for the Problems of Youth should be created; such a Council would be responsible for the co-ordination of the activities of the United Nations and specialized agencies in the field of youth in order that proper and favourable conditions for a better life, work and education are guaranteed for youth and in general would deal with problems with which youth are concerned all over the world today.
