LIST OF COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED BY THE SUB-COMMISSION (E/CN.4/Sub.2/CR.1)

The CHAIRMAN announced that the meeting, which would be held in closed session, had been called in order to allow the Secretariat to distribute a confidential list of communications, and in order to decide on the method of examining those communications.

Mr. LAWSON explained that the list was to remain secret, and asked the members of the Sub-Commission to be good enough to return it after they had studied it.

With regard to the procedure to be adopted, he said that it was usual for the Chairman of the organ concerned to appoint a small committee to examine the communications received and report on them.

Mr. SHAFAGH asked whether the members of the Sub-Commission were entitled to communicate the list to their respective governments.

Mr. LAWSON saw no objection, particularly since the Secretariat automatically sent all documents of that kind to the governments of Member States.

The CHAIRMAN appointed Miss Monroe, together with Mr. Borisov, Mr. Daniels, Mr. Meneses Pallares and Mr. Chang, to form a committee to examine the communications. The committee was to report to the Sub-Commission at the meeting to be held on Tuesday, 21 June.
