#### **Report of the Secretariat**

1. The present note was prepared pursuant to Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice resolution 20/1, entitled “Improving the governance and financial situation of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime: recommendations of the standing open-ended intergovernmental working group on improving the governance and financial situation of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime”, in which the Commission recommended that a short and concise report on the implementation of resolutions should be submitted by the Secretariat to the Commission at the part of its session held in the first half of the year.
