**Follow-up to the commemoration of the two-hundredth
anniversary of the abolition of the transatlantic slave trade**

Permanent memorial to and remembrance of the victims of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade: status of the United Nations Trust Fund for Partnerships — Permanent Memorial

Report of the Secretary-General

I. Introduction

1. In paragraph 14 of its resolution 66/114, the General Assembly requested the United Nations Office for Partnerships, through the Secretary-General, to submit a comprehensive report to the Assembly at its sixty-seventh session on the status of the United Nations Trust Fund for Partnerships — Permanent Memorial, established with a view to implementing the initiative to erect a permanent memorial in honour of the victims of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade.

2. The present report is submitted pursuant to that request.

II. Status of the Trust Fund

3. As at 30 June 2012, a total of \$1,312,304 had been recorded as income received under the United Nations Trust Fund for Partnerships — Permanent Memorial, including voluntary contributions from Member States amounting to \$1,143,389 and public and private donations totalling \$108,562. The breakdown of the contributions received is provided in the annex to the present report. With respect to expenditures charged to the Trust Fund, it may be noted that an amount of \$171,000 has been utilized, mostly for a grant made to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) (\$91,000) in connection with the international design competition for the permanent memorial, and for

contractual services (\$69,328). The Fund had an unspent balance of \$1,141,304 as at 30 June 2012.

4. In keeping with the intention of the General Assembly expressed in its resolutions 64/15 and 65/239, the Committee of interested States established to oversee the permanent memorial project (Permanent Memorial Committee) and the United Nations have jointly collaborated with UNESCO to launch an international design competition for the permanent memorial, in view of the considerable experience of UNESCO with the Slave Route Project and international competitions and its worldwide presence through its network of field offices and national commissions. In accordance with a tripartite memorandum of understanding and project document, UNESCO has implemented the first phase of the competition by providing shortlisted designs from a number of proposals received globally. The Permanent Memorial Committee is taking the next steps with respect to the selection of the winning design on the basis of the recommendation of an international panel of judges. It is anticipated that, as agreed by the Member States, a sum of \$50,000 will be awarded to the winning design at the conclusion of the competition. All expenses relating to the competition are covered by the Trust Fund.

5. The Permanent Memorial Committee is continuing its efforts to raise additional contributions from Member States, the corporate sector, philanthropists and other private individuals. The annual concert organized by the Department of Public Information as part of the commemorative events in honour of the victims of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade was used in 2012 as an occasion to raise awareness of and funds for the permanent memorial. The Committee is committed to ensuring that voluntary funds received from Member States are earmarked for tangible aspects of the project, including the international design competition and the construction of the monument, unless otherwise authorized by the Member States. The United Nations Office for Partnerships has administered the Trust Fund accordingly.
