Statement submitted by Child Care Consortium, a non-governmental organization in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council

The Secretary-General has received the following statement, which is being circulated in accordance with paragraphs 30 and 31 of Economic and Social Council resolution 1996/31.

Statement

Human health, environment and learning and training processes promote productive capacity for employability, from childhood to the age of 20 to 25 years.

The learning and training age limit should not exceed 25 years.

The employment age limit should not exceed 60 years.

Decent work involves opportunities to work from the age of 20 to 60 years.

After completion at the age of 60, humans need to be placed in consultancy or advisory groups all over the world in such fields as health, the environment, teaching and training to promote productive capacity of the human population.

The enjoyment of decent work is the right of all people, be they male, female or transgender, to achieve Goal 3 of the Millennium Development Goals.

Providing fair income, security, social protection and prospects for personal development and social integration, freedom and dignity is the responsibility of governments and employers and should be brought under a legal framework of the United Nations, including sanctions.

These definitions of decent work should be applied as part of the annual ministerial review to eradicate poverty in the context of inclusive, sustainable and equitable economic growth at all levels to achieve all of the Goals.
