## THE SITUATION IN KAMPUCHEA

## PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1984-1985

Programme budget implications of draft resolution A/39/L.3Report of the Fifth CommitteeRapporteur: Mr. Ali Achraf MOJTAHED (Islamic Republic of Iran)

1. At its 18th meeting, on 29 October 1984, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/28) on the programme budget implications of the draft resolution in document A/39/L.3. The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/39/SR.18).

## DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 89 to 16, with 10 abstentions, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/39/L.3, an amount of \$170,400 would be required in 1985 under section 3B of the programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985 with respect to the activities of the Ad Hoc Committee of the International Conference on Kampuchea. In addition, an amount of \$18,000 would be required for staff assessment under section 31, to be offset by an increase of the same amount in the estimates of income under income section 1.

4. The voting was as follows:

Against: Angola, Bulgaria, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Congo, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Democratic Yemen, Ethiopia, German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mongolia, Poland, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Viet Nam.

Abstaining: Burkina Faso, Finland, India, Lebanon, Mexico, Mozambique, Panama, Qatar, United Arab Emirates, United Republic of Tanzania.

5. The Fifth Committee further decided, by a recorded vote of 93 to 16, with 7 abstentions, to inform the General Assembly that, should a decision to reconvene the International Conference on Kampuchea be reached in the course of 1985, the Secretary-General would be authorized to enter into the necessary commitments, with the prior concurrence of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, in accordance with the terms of General Assembly resolution 38/237 of 20 December 1983 on unforeseen and extraordinary expenses for the biennium 1984-1985.

Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Somalia, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Suriname, Swaziland, Sweden, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Turkey, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Venezuela, Yemen, Yugoslavia, Zambia, Zimbabwe.

Against: Angola, Bulgaria, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Congo, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Democratic Yemen, Ethiopia, German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mongolia, Poland, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Viet Nam.

Abstaining: Burkina Faso, Finland, India, Mexico, Mozambique, Panama, United Republic of Tanzania.

7. The Fifth Committee further decided, without a vote, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/39/L.3, an additional appropriation of \$373,400 would be required in 1985 under section 3E of the programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985 with respect to the co-ordination of the Programme of Humanitarian Assistance to the Kampuchean People. In addition, an amount of \$81,700 would be required for staff assessment under section 3I, to be offset by an increase of the same amount in the estimates of income under income section 1.

8. Statements in explanation of vote before the vote were made by the representatives of Brazil, Cameroon, Democratic Kampuchea, Egypt and Viet Nam.

9. Statements in explanation of vote after the vote were made by the representatives of the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Cuba, Mexico, Viet Nam and Yugoslavia.
