*Global development cooperation: The evolving role of private philanthropic organizations and decentralized cooperation*

*A panel discussion on the topic “Private philanthropic organizations”, chaired by the President and moderated by Mr. Ron Bruder (Founder and Chairman, Global Board of Directors, Education for Employment), was held.
