Report of the Secretary-General concerning the credentials of the representatives and deputies and alternate representatives of the members of the Security Council elected for the period 2014-2015

1. At its 34th plenary meeting, on 17 October 2013, the General Assembly elected Chad, Chile, Lithuania, Nigeria and Saudi Arabia as non-permanent members of the Security Council for a term of two years beginning on 1 January 2014. On 18 October 2013, Saudi Arabia declined its seat in the Security Council ([A/68/599](#)). On 6 December 2013, Jordan was elected as non-permanent member of the Security Council for a term of two years beginning on 1 January 2014.
