CORRIGENDA TO THE SUMMARY RECORD OF THE THIRTEENTH MEETING

Held at Lake Success, New York,
on Tuesday, 29 August 1950, at 11 a.m.Page 7Paragraph 25Line 6: Replace the word "territories" by the word "states".Line 8: Replace the word "proper" by the words "substantial professional".Page 8Paragraphs 26-28: Replace these paragraphs by the following:

"26. Document A/AC.35/L.3, for which the Secretariat deserved congratulations, showed that several general conclusions could be drawn from the experience acquired by the Administering Powers in that field. The most important was undoubtedly that already mentioned during the debates on other items considered by the Committee, namely that social welfare programmes, including training programmes, should be intimately related to the life of the people and their needs.

"27. It was therefore important that the indigenous inhabitants themselves should be trained to promote and carry out social welfare programmes. While outside experts might be necessary at present, it was to be hoped that such experts would as soon as possible be replaced by indigenous personnel, trained in their own Territories or in institutions serving a number of Territories in a region.

"28. Attention should also be given to the need to enable the indigenous inhabitants to receive advanced professional training in first-class graduate schools most of which were located in metropolitan centres outside the Non-Self-Governing Territories. The United States believed that indigenous inhabitants should have the opportunity for such advanced training and also for observing practical social work done in the countries of their stay, but it was obvious that such outside experience could in no case take the place of training and experience in the Territories themselves. Consultation on programmes and training with experts of the United Nations and the specialized agencies might be requested and such services would increasingly be made available."
