CORRIGENDA TO THE SUMMARY RECORD OF THE SIXTEENTH MEETING

Held at Lake Success, New York,
on Wednesday, 30 August 1950, at 3 p.m.

Page 5

Paragraph 6:

Replace paragraph 6 by the following text:

"6. Mr. FLETCHER-COSSE (United Kingdom) agreed with the representative of the Philippines as to the desirability of disseminating information about the United Nations in the Non-Self-Governing Territories. Indeed his Government was fully in accord with the idea of disseminating information about the United Nations in the United Kingdom itself, in its Non-Self-Governing Territories and in its Trust Territories. He did however disagree with the representative of the Philippines as regards the method to be used in dealing with that problem. There was an important difference which should be underlined. As regards its three Trust Territories the United Kingdom was responsible for their administration under the general supervision of the Trusteeship Council. It was right and proper, and indeed essential, that information relating to United Nations and in particular to chapters 12 and 13 of the Charter should be disseminated in the Trust Territories in accordance with the resolutions of the Trusteeship Council on that subject and the United Kingdom was ready, and indeed bound, to submit in its annual reports an account of the action taken in accordance with those resolutions.

As regards the United Kingdom itself and the Non-Self-Governing Territories, the position was quite different. In that case the United Kingdom made no distinction between the the United Kingdom itself and its Non-Self-Governing Territories.

Like any other member of the United Nations, the United Kingdom was ready to submit to the United Nations an account of the action taken to comply with the resolutions passed by the Economic and Social Council and by the General Assembly on that subject. In those circumstances the United Kingdom had submitted and would continue to submit a comprehensive report covering the action taken in respect of both the United Kingdom and its Non-Self-Governing Territories. With slight modifications made necessary by specific local conditions, it proposed to take the same measures in the United Kingdom and in the Non-Self-Governing Territories in implementing those decisions."

Paragraph 7, line 1: Insert the word "Thus" before "The United Kingdom's reports"

Paragraph 7, lines 3 and 4: Delete the words "While it was prepared to discuss the dependent areas".

Paragraph 7, line 5: Replace the word "it" by "Therefore the United Kingdom"

Paragraph 7, line 7: Insert the words "in the comprehensive report" before "to the United Nations."

Page 9

Paragraph 19, line 2: For "receiving" read "having before it".

Paragraph 19, lines 8 and 9: For "Committee; but he hoped his Government would not be asked" read "Committee; but his Government was not prepared"

Page 10

Paragraph 20, line 4: For "procedure" read "suggestion".

Paragraph 20, line 13: Add the following at the end of the paragraph: "In the case of the Trust Territories, as he had already indicated, the special status of those Territories rendered it necessary and desirable that the inhabitants should be specifically made aware of, for example, the rights of petition, visiting missions, etc. These
