¹ Note by the Secretariat: at its 2nd plenary meeting, on 19 September 2014, the General Assembly decided to approve the recommendation contained in paragraph 73 (b) of the first report of the General Committee (A/69/250), which reads:

(b) Item 96 (General and complete disarmament). The General Committee took note of the fact that some portions of the annual report of the International Atomic Energy Agency, which is to be considered directly in plenary meeting under item 86, deal with the subject matter of item 96. The General Committee therefore decided to recommend to the General Assembly that the relevant paragraphs of the report be drawn to the attention of the First Committee in connection with its consideration of item 96.
