Adoption of the agenda (E/L.1145/Add.3)

1. The PRESIDENT asked the Council to decide on whether the thirteen items enumerated in paragraph 1 of the note by the Secretary-General (E/L.1145/Add.3) should be placed on its agenda.

2. Mr. Donald MACDONALD (Canada) said that, although it did not wish to exclude any item from the agenda, his delegation would prefer that a detailed discussion of item 13 concerning the annual report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees should be postponed to the Council's forty-second session.

3. The PRESIDENT proposed that the Council should place on its agenda the thirteen items he had just mentioned.

It was so decided.

4. The PRESIDENT proposed that the Council should adopt the proposals made by the Secretary-General in paragraphs 2 and 3 of his note, namely, that items 1 to 8, 10 and 13 should be discussed in November and that items 9, 11 and 12 should be discussed on 21, 19 and 20 December, respectively.

It was so decided.

Organization of work

5. The PRESIDENT proposed that, in order to allow the Commissioner for Industrial Development to attend the discussion, the Council should examine agenda item 5 concerning the International Symposium on Industrial Development on that same day. It could then deal with the report on the establishment of a United Nations capital development fund (item 1) and then, if it still had time, with the establishment of an international institute for documentation on housing, building and planning (item 4).

6. Mr. RAHNEMA (Iran) said that he had no objection to item 5 being examined first but requested, on behalf of the developing countries group, that discussion of the question where the Symposium would be held should be postponed to Thursday afternoon so that the delegations belonging to that group could continue their consultations.

7. Mr. CARANICAS (Greece) said he supported that proposal, but suggested that the Council should discuss the date of the Symposium forthwith.

8. Mr. MAKEEV (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) said that it would be difficult to separate the closely connected questions of the date and place of the Symposium. He therefore suggested that discussion of both questions should be postponed to Thursday afternoon.

9. The PRESIDENT proposed that the Council should adopt the suggestion made by the representative of the Soviet Union.

It was so decided.

10. The PRESIDENT proposed that all the elections provided for in item 7 should be held on the following day and that the discussion of the report of the Trade and Development Board (item 2) should be held on Thursday in order to allow the Secretary-General of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development to participate.

11. Mr. KHALAF (Iraq), supported by Mr. RAHNEMA (Iran), asked that the elections should be postponed to Thursday so that the negotiations on nominations could continue.

12. Mr. LOPEZ (Philippines) said he supported that suggestion, since some of the regional groups did not yet have enough candidates to give full effect to the principles of geographical distribution. He was afraid that the Council, if it decided to hold the elections the following day, might be obliged to hold a second election at a later time.

13. Mr. KITTANI (Secretary of the Council), speaking at the invitation of the President, pointed out that the Council should endeavour to limit the number of

its meetings in November, since the Second Committee of the General Assembly could not meet when the Council was meeting. He believed, however, that the elections proposed for the next day could be replaced by a discussion of the composition of the

Committee for Programme and Co-ordination (item 10), and the calendar of conferences for 1967 (item 6).

It was so decided.

The meeting rose at 12.55 p.m.
