International Law Association

The forty-second Conference of the International Law Association, held in Prague September 1947, decided:

1. to set up study Committees on:
 - (a) the legal effects of the United Nations Charter regarding human rights;
 - (b) the powers and the constitution of the Commission on Human Rights;
 - (c) the contents and enforcement of an International Bill of Human Rights;
 - (d) the interpretation and enforcement of human rights recognized in the Peace Treaties.
2. that the submission of an International Bill of the Rights of Man to the General Assembly of the United Nations should be preceded by adequate study by both the organs of the United Nations and non-governmental bodies but that such submission should not be delayed beyond the year 1950.

3. to support the Resolution of the Economic and Social Council of 21 June 1946 which declared that the purposes of the United Nations with regard to Human Rights can be fulfilled only if provisions are made for the implementation of human rights and of an International Bill of Rights.
