OFFERS OF STUDY AND TRAINING FACILITIES UNDER
RESOLUTION 845 (IX) OF 22 NOVEMBER 1954

Report of the Secretary-General

In addition to the communications relating to facilities for study and training available under General Assembly resolution 845 (IX) of 22 November 1954 which were treated in documents A/2937 (paragraph 13 and annex IV), A/2937/Add.1, A/2937/Add.2 and A/2937/Add.3/Rev.1, the Secretary-General has received a communication from Burma, substantive parts of which read as follows:

BURMA

Letter dated 17 October 1955 from the Permanent Representative of
Burma to the United Nations

Under instructions from my Government, I have the honour to convey to you the offer by the Government of the Union of Burma of three scholarships to be rded to students from the United Nations Trust Territories and four olarships to be awarded to students from the Non-Self-Governing Territories order to assist the educational advancement of these territories and in entation of General Assembly resolutions 753 (VIII) and 845 (IX).

the details regarding these scholarships:

students from Trust Territories

at of the Union of Burma well provide each student from
Trust Territories with a maintenance grant of K.250/-

(Kyats two hundred and fifty only) per month, with free tuition, and an allowance for text books not exceeding K.200/- (Kyats two hundred only) per annum as necessary in their studies. The travelling expenses to and from Burma are to be paid by the students themselves or by the respective Government of the United Nations Trust Territories.

2. Scholarships for students from Non-Self-Governing Territories

The students from the Non-Self-Governing Territories will be given the same allowances and facilities as in the case of the students from the United Nations Trust Territories but, in addition, their passage by sea from the port of embarkation in their home country to Burma and back will be borne by the Union Government.

3. Students selected from both the Trust Territories and the Non-Self-Governing Territories should either be university graduates or they must possess sufficient knowledge of the English language, both oral and written, with an educational standard equivalent to a pass in the secondary or high school examination.

4. Scholarship holders will be treated as special students while studying in Burma and the scholarships will be tenable for one to two years in the case of university graduates and for three years in the case of other students.

5. The students can be admitted to:

The University of Rangoon, Rangoon,
The Government Technical Institute, Insein,
The Government Technical Institute, Mandalay,
or, The Agricultural Institute, Pyinmana,

depending on their field of interest, aptitude and qualifications.

6. Students will stay in residential hostels along with Burmese students and will have the same messing facilities.

7. The academic year in the institutions mentioned in paragraph 5 normally begins in June, and it would be convenient if the selected candidates can arrive in Burma by the end of May.
