Letter dated 24 April 1969 from the Permanent Representative of  
Mongolia to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

With reference to the letters dated 3 and 31 March 1969 addressed to you by the Permanent Representatives of France, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, contained in documents A/7521 and A/7541, I have the honour to state the following:

In the mentioned letters the three Western Powers have again reiterated their groundless and irrational allegations with regard to the status of the German Democratic Republic, whose well-established reputation as a sovereign State has been widely recognized throughout the world.

The existence of the German Democratic Republic, a peace-loving socialist State, is an unquestionable reality and no statements of non-recognition can affect her status.

I should be grateful if this letter could be circulated as an official document of the General Assembly.
