UNITED NATIONS PROGRAMMES OF TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION

Note by the Secretary-GeneralReview of activities (sub-item (a))

1. The attention of the General Assembly is invited, in this connexion, to chapter IV, sections I, II and IV, of the annual report of the Economic and Social Council.^{1/} It may be mentioned that, in its resolution 900 (XXXIV), the Council invited the Assembly "to authorize the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions to bring up to date the studies which it made in response to General Assembly resolution 722 (VIII) of 23 October 1953, in the light of the developments which have occurred since the earlier studies were made, giving particular attention to the question of financial procedures and overhead costs of the programmes of technical co-operation...". The Assembly's attention is also invited to Council resolution 902 (XXXIV), approving participation by the Universal Postal Union in the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance.

Confirmation of the Allocation of Funds under the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance (sub-item (b))
