QUESTION OF OMAN

Letter dated 8 November 1962 from the Permanent Representative of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the United Nations addressed to the President of the General Assembly

I understand that His Highness the Sultan of Muscat and Oman has recently addressed a telegram to Your Excellency as President of the General Assembly about item 79 on the Assembly's agenda, the question of Oman.

Since Muscat and Oman is not a member of the United Nations, I have the honour to request, on behalf of His Highness the Sultan of Muscat and Oman, that this telegram be circulated to all Members of the United Nations.

YOU WILL REMEMBER THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY LAST YEAR DECLINED TO ADOPT A RESOLUTION CONCERNED WITH THE SULTANATE STOP WE ARE THEREFORE UNABLE TO UNDERSTAND WHY IT IS NECESSARY TO DISCUSS AGAIN THIS YEAR A RESOLUTION WHICH WAS ALREADY REJECTED LAST YEAR STOP WE TRUST THAT THE DISTINGUISHED DELEGATES TO THE PRESENT ASSEMBLY WILL FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE OF THEIR PREDECESSORS AND REFUSE TO PERMIT ANY FURTHER MOVES TO INTERVENE IN MATTERS WHICH FALL EXCLUSIVELY WITHIN THE INTERNAL JURISDICTION OF THE SULTANATE OF MUSCAT AND OMAN STOP WE REQUEST THAT THIS COMMUNICATION BE CIRCULATED TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS
