THE POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT  
OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In his note of 28 April 1967 (A/6667), the Secretary-General stated that, in pursuance of General Assembly resolution 2202 A (XXI) of 16 December 1966 and after consultation with the Special Committee on the Policies of Apartheid of the Government of the Republic of South Africa and the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, it had been decided to organize an international Seminar on Apartheid, Racial Discrimination and Colonialism in Southern Africa, from 15 to 28 July 1967, at Dar es Salaam.
2. The Secretary-General has now been informed that the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania regrets that it is not now able to host the Seminar because of financial reasons.
3. The Secretary-General is, therefore, obliged to cancel the present arrangements for the Seminar. The Secretary-General hopes, however, that alternative arrangements can be made to organize the Seminar as early as possible. He will undertake further consultations with the two Committees concerned and will inform the General Assembly in due course.
