THE POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT  
OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In a note of 6 July 1967 (A/6667/Add.3), the Secretary-General reported that, in pursuance of operative paragraph 6 (a) of General Assembly resolution 2202 A (XXI) of 16 December 1966, the International Seminar on Apartheid, Racial Discrimination and Colonialism would be organized at Lusaka from 24 July to 4 August 1967.
2. The Secretary-General has now been informed by the Government of Zambia that, owing to certain practical difficulties, it was obliged to propose a change of venue to Kitwe.
3. The Secretary-General has consulted with the officers of the Special Committee on the Policies of Apartheid of the Government of the Republic of South Africa and of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples who have advised him to accept the change of venue in view of the request of the host Government and the very short time available before the Seminar.
4. The Secretary-General has, therefore, decided to organize the Seminar at Kitwe, instead of Lusaka, from 24 July to 4 August 1967.
