Addendum

Subsequent to the issuance of document A/9241, the Governments of Austria and India made the following additional offers of scholarships to inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories in response to General Assembly resolution 845 (IX) of 22 November 1954 and other resolutions pertaining to scholarships adopted in recent years. These offers are noted below.

Austria

In a statement made at the 2066th meeting of the Fourth Committee of the General Assembly, on 26 November 1973, the representative of Austria announced that the Austrian Interministerial Committee on Development Questions had decided on 19 November to grant the sum of 370,000 Austrian schillings (approximately \$US 20,000) for the financing of two scholarships to inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories for a two-year course at the Teacher's Training College for Technical Professions at Moedling.

The next course is scheduled to begin in April 1974 and will focus on the training of teachers in electrical engineering.

India

In a note dated 19 November 1973, the Permanent Representative of India informed the Secretary-General that, under its General Cultural Scholarships Scheme, his Government awarded a certain number of scholarships each year to students from Non-Self-Governing Territories and that the scholarships included travelling expenses for the students.

The number of awards made during 1972/73 was as follows: Territories under Portuguese administration, 2; South Africa, 10; Southern Rhodesia, 5; and Namibia, 2.
