REQUESTS FOR HEARINGS

Note by the Secretary-General: In accordance with the decision taken by the Fourth Committee at its 584th meeting, the following communications, all of which refer to requests for hearings already granted by the Committee, are circulated to members of the Committee for their information.

1. Letter dated 6 December 1956 from the "Jeunesse démocratique du Caméroun" to the Secretary-General 1/

Douala, 6 December 1956

We acknowledge receipt of your communication informing us that the United Nations has granted our request for a hearing. We thank you very much.

We draw the attention of the great international Organization to the fact that the prohibition of our movement by the French Government on 13 July 1955 places us in serious difficulties, particularly with regard to obtaining documents for inter-continental travel, such as passports, exit and entry visas etc.

So we are appealing once more to the good will of the United Nations, to obtain for us international travel documents to enable our representative to go to New York without any trouble.

We do not want to inform you of the name of our representative yet, for fear that the French Government might make difficulties for him and prevent his leaving at the proper time. We are going to make all our arrangements and we shall inform you as soon as possible of the name and address of the representative who will come to state our case before the eleventh session of the United Nations General Assembly.
