NOTIFICATION BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
UNDER ARTICLE 12, PARAGRAPH 2, OF
THE CHARTER

In accordance with the provisions of Article 12, paragraph 2, of the Charter and with the consent of the Security Council, I have the honour to notify the General Assembly of matters relative to the maintenance of international peace and security which are being dealt with by the Security Council and also of matters with which the Security Council has ceased to deal.

The matters relative to the maintenance of international peace and security which are being dealt with by the Security Council, as set forth in the "Summary Statement by the Secretary-General of matters of which the Security Council is seized and of the stage reached in their consideration" dated 13 September 1950 (document S/1785) are as follows:

1. The regulation and reduction of conventional armaments and armed forces
2. Special agreements under Article 43 of the Charter and the organization of the armed forces to be made available to the Security Council
3. The Indonesian question
4. The Egyptian question
5. The Iranian question
6. The question of the Free Territory of Trieste
7. Appointment of a Governor for the Free Territory of Trieste
8. The Palestine question
9. The India-Pakistan question
10. The Hyderabad question
11. The Czechoslovakian question
12. Identic notifications dated 29 September 1948 from the Governments of the French Republic, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America
13. International control of atomic energy
14. Complaint of aggression upon the Republic of Korea
15. Complaint of armed invasion of Taiwan (Formosa)
16. Complaint of bombing by air forces of the territory of China

The Security Council has continued to deal with all matters relative to the maintenance of international peace and security with which it was seized or has been seized since the notification to the General Assembly under Article 12, paragraph 2, at the fourth regular session (A/979).
