SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE **SECRETARY-GENERAL** ON MATTERS **OF WHICH**
THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON **THE** STAGE REACHED IN
THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to **rule 11** of the provisional rules **of procedure** of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/21100 of 24 January 1990, **S/21100/Add.2** of 2 February 1990, **S/21100/Add.5** of 16 February 1990 and **S/21100/Add.21** of 7 June 1990.

During the week ending 30 June 1990, the **Security Council** took **action on the** following **item**:

The situation concerning Western Sahara (see **S/11593/Add.42**, **S/11593/Add.44** and **S/19420/Add.38**)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the **item** at its 2929th meeting, on 27 June 1990, in **accordance** with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, **having** before **it** the report **of** the Secretary-General on the situation concerning Western Sahara (**S/21360** and **Corr.1** in French only).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/21376), which had been prepared in the **course** of the Council's consultations,

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (**S/21376**), and adopted it unanimously as resolution 658 (1990).

Resolution 658 (1990) reads as **follows**:

The Security Council,

Recalling its resolution 621 (1988) of 20 September 1988, **by** which it decided to **authorize** the Secretary-General to appoint a Special Representative for Western Sahara and to request the Secretary-General to **transmit to it as**

soon as possible a report **on the** holding of a referendum for self-determination **of the people of Western Sahara and on** ways and means to ensure **the** organisation and supervision **of** such a referendum by **the** United Nations in co-operation with the Organisation **of African Unity**,

Recalling also that, on 30 August 1988, the Kingdom of Morocco and the Frente Popular **para la Liberación** de Saguia el-Hamra y de Rio de Oro gave their agreement in principle to the proposals of the United Nations Secretary-General and the current Chairman **of the Organisation of African Unity in the framework of their joint mission of good offices**,

Having considered the report of the Secretary-General on the situation concerning Western Sahara (S/21360),

1. **Expresses** its full support to the Secretary-General in his mission of good offices, pursued jointly with the current Chairman of the Organisation of **African Unity**, with a view to settling the question of Western Sahara;

2. **Approves** the report of the Secretary-General, transmitted to the Security Council *in* accordance with resolution 621 (1988) with a view to settling the question of Western Sahara, which contains the **full** text of the settlement proposals as accepted by the two parties on 30 August 1988 as well as an outline of the plan provided by the Secretary-General in order to implement those propoalsr

3. **C a l l s** the two parties to co-operate fully with the Secretary-General of the United Nations and the current Chairman of the Organiaatlon **of African Unity** in their efforts aimed at an early settlement of the question of Western Sahara;

4. **Welcomes** the intention of the Secretary-General to dispatch, **in** the immediate future, a technical mission to the territory and to neighbouring countries, **in** particular to refine the administrative aspects of the outlined plan and to obtain the necessary information for the preparation of a further report to the Security **Council**;

5. **Requests** the Secretary-General **to** transmit to the Security Council as **soon as** possible a further detailed report on his implementation plan, containing in particular an estimate of the cost of the United Nations Mission for the referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO), on the understanding that this further report should be the basis on which the Security Council would **authorize** the establishment of MINURSO,
