I. DRAFT RESOLUTION RECOMMENDED FOR APPROVAL BY
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

1. The Committee on Conferences submits the following draft resolution to the General Assembly:

Pattern of conferences

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolutions 1202 (XII) of 13 December 1957, 1851 (XVII) of 19 December 1962, 1987 (XVIII) of 17 December 1963, 2116 (XX) of 21 December 1965, 2239 (XXI) of 20 December 1966, 2361 (XXII) of 19 December 1967, 2478 (XXIII) of 21 December 1968, 2609 (XXIV) of 16 December 1969, 2693 (XXV) of 11 December 1970, 2834 (XXVI) of 17 December 1971, 2960 (XXVII) of 13 December 1972, 3350 (XXIX) and 3351 (XXIX) of 18 December 1974, 3491 (XXX) of 15 December 1975, 31/140, section I, of 17 December 1976, 38/32 C of 25 November 1983 and 39/68 C of 13 December 1984,

I

Having considered the report of the Committee on Conferences, 1/

1. Takes note with appreciation of the report of the Committee on Conferences;
2. Approves the draft calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for the biennium 1986-1987 as submitted by the Committee on Conferences; 2/
3. Authorizes the Committee on Conferences to make any adjustments in the calendar of conferences and meetings for the biennium 1986-1987 that may become necessary as a result of action and decisions taken by the General Assembly at its fortieth session;
4. Reaffirms the general principle that, in drawing up the schedule of conferences and meetings, United Nations bodies shall plan to meet at their respective established headquarters, with the following exceptions:
 - (a) The regular sessions of the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme shall be held alternately at United Nations Headquarters and at the United Nations Office at Geneva;
 - (b) The sessions of the International Law Commission shall be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva;

(c) The sessions of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law may be held, subject to the provision in section II, paragraph 6, of General Assembly resolution 2205 (XXI) of 17 December 1966, alternately at United Nations Headquarters and at the United Nations Office at Vienna;

(d) The second regular session of the Economic and Social Council may be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva provided that the closing date falls at least six weeks before the opening of the regular session of the General Assembly;

(e) The functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council shall meet at their established headquarters unless another place is designated by the Council to achieve a more rational pattern of the work programme, taking into account any recommendation of the commission concerned and in consultation with the Secretary-General;

(f) The regular sessions of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific, the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean, the Economic Commission for Africa and the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia, as well as meetings of their subsidiary bodies, may be held away from their headquarters when the commission concerned so decides, subject, in the case of regular sessions of the commissions, to the approval of the Economic and Social Council and of the General Assembly;

(g) The International Civil Service Commission shall hold its regular annual session at United Nations Headquarters and, if more than one session is required in any one year, may accept an invitation from one of its participating organizations to hold its other session or sessions at the headquarters of that particular organization;

(h) The sessions of the Legal Sub-Committee of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space shall be held alternately at United Nations Headquarters and the United Nations Office at Geneva;

(i) The Conference on Disarmament shall meet at the United Nations Office at Geneva;

5. Decides that United Nations bodies may hold sessions away from their established headquarters when a Government issuing an invitation for a session to be held within its territory has agreed to defray, after consultation with the Secretary-General as to their nature and possible extent, the actual additional costs directly or indirectly involved;

6. Reaffirms its instruction to all its subsidiary organs to complete their reports for the following session of the General Assembly not later than 1 September and to report any activity after the adoption of such reports, where necessary, to the Assembly in addenda to the reports of the organs concerned;

7. Decides that no subsidiary organ of the General Assembly may meet at United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly;

8. Requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide interpretation services for informal meetings on an ad hoc basis in accordance with established practice;

9. Authorizes the Secretary-General to apply maximum overprogramming of meetings whenever possible to achieve better utilization of conference resources;

10. Requests the Committee on Conferences and the Secretary-General to take account of the following principles in drawing up the draft calendar of conferences and meetings:

(a) The biennial calendar of conferences and meetings approved by the General Assembly shall govern the meetings programme during the period concerned;

(b) All United Nations meetings shall be carried out within the resources allocated by the General Assembly for that purpose;

(c) Between sessions of the General Assembly, departures from the calendar may, in special or unusual circumstances, be approved by the Committee on Conferences, provided that changes affecting the subsequent year of the biennium shall be approved by the Assembly;

(d) Subsidiary organs of the General Assembly shall not, without the approval of the Assembly, create new standing bodies or ad hoc sessional or intersessional bodies that require additional resources, and other principal organs of the United Nations should make similar decisions with regard to their respective subsidiary bodies, if they have not already done so;

(e) An adequate interval of time, to be determined by the body concerned, shall be allowed between sessions of the same bodies to permit Member States to derive maximum benefit from the activities and to provide sufficient time for the preparation of future activities;

(f) United Nations bodies shall meet at their respective established headquarters, subject to the exceptions to this principle approved by the General Assembly;

(g) The implications of the capacity of the documentation services of the Secretariat to process and issue in time the documentation required for the sessions of all scheduled organs should be taken into account;

(h) No more than one special conference of the United Nations shall be convened at the same time;

(i) In any given year, no more than five special conferences should be convened, unless the General Assembly specifically decides otherwise;

11. Requests the Secretary-General to ensure the most rational and effective use of all United Nations conference centres and facilities;

12. Requests the Committee on Conferences to continue its periodic examination of the rules governing conference planning.

II

1. Urges all United Nations bodies to increase their efforts to ensure that their requests for conference-servicing resources correspond accurately to their requirements;

2. Further urges those bodies to plan their work well in advance in order to make full use of the conference-servicing resources allocated to them and so that any unused conference-servicing resources can be reassigned to ensure their most effective utilization;

3. Requests subsidiary organs of the General Assembly to include in their reports to the Assembly a statement on the progress made in response to the relevant provisions of Assembly resolution 39/68 B on the rational and efficient utilization of conference-servicing resources;

4. Urges intergovernmental bodies reporting to the Second Committee of the General Assembly that have not yet adjusted their meeting cycles to conform to that Committee's biennial programme of work to do so as soon as possible;

5. Requests the Secretary-General to review the composition and frequency of planning missions for meetings and conferences held away from Headquarters and, in particular, those sent to cities where United Nations conference facilities already exist;

6. Further requests the Secretary-General to report to the Committee on Conferences at its substantive session of 1986 on the results of that review concerning planning missions sent in 1985 and, as far as possible, in 1986.

III

1. Decides that the Committee on Conferences should review the question of the provision of summary records at its substantive session in 1986;

2. Further decides that the present experimental arrangements for summary records, established by the General Assembly in its resolution 37/14 C of 16 November 1982, should remain in effect until the Assembly, upon the recommendation of the Committee on Conferences, takes further action.

II. CALENDAR OF CONFERENCES

A. Adoption of the draft calendar of conferences and meetings for the biennium 1986-1987

2. By its resolution 38/32 A of 25 November 1983, the General Assembly approved the biennial calendar of conferences and meetings for 1984-1985 as set out in annex II to the report of the Committee on Conferences to the Assembly at its thirty-eighth session 3/ and amended by subsequent decisions taken by the Assembly in the course of that session. By its resolution 39/68 A of 13 December 1984, the Assembly approved the draft revised calendar for 1985. 4/
3. At its 233rd meeting, on 28 August 1985, the Committee commenced discussion of the draft calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for the biennium 1986-1987.
4. During the discussion of the draft calendar for 1986-1987, a number of deviations from established practices were brought to the attention of the Committee in a Secretariat report accompanying the draft calendar (see A/AC.172/1985/CRP.7, para. 5).
5. Members subsequently noted a further deviation in the draft calendar. This concerned the venue of the Fifth United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names (see Economic and Social Council decision 1983/120 of 26 May 1983), scheduled to be held at Montreal in 1987. It was explained that this deviation had been approved by the Council under the terms of paragraph 5 of General Assembly resolution 31/140, section I, of 17 December 1976.
6. Members noted further that several bodies were listed with the dates and venues to be determined although, in accordance with paragraph 4 of Assembly resolution 31/140, bodies should plan to meet at their established headquarters. It was later agreed that wherever the venue was listed as "to be determined", the established headquarters location would be substituted.
7. Several delegations noted that in some instances conferences whose dates and/or venues were yet to be determined were included in the draft calendar. It was proposed that such conferences should not be included in the draft calendar unless the General Assembly had decided on the year in which the conference was to take place. It was also suggested that a separate section of the calendar should present information in those cases where a decision in principle had been taken to convene a conference but the dates and/or venue had yet to be determined. Other delegations felt that the draft calendar should reflect all conferences mandated by the Assembly and queried whether placing such conferences in a separate section might not lead to questions as to their status. One delegation proposed that this matter should be included in the work programme of the Committee for 1986.

8. Another delegation noted that, in accordance with General Assembly resolution 39/217 of 18 December 1984, intergovernmental bodies reporting to the Second Committee had been requested to adjust their cycle of meetings to conform to that Committee's biennial programme of work. Information was presented on bodies that meet biennially and those that continue to meet annually. A delegation urged that the Committee include in its report a recommendation drawing the attention of the Assembly to those bodies that had not adjusted their meeting cycles and requesting them to do so as soon as possible.

9. It was noted that the experimental period of three years laid down in resolution 37/14 C for the provision of summary records to subsidiary bodies of the General Assembly was due to expire at the end of 1985. After an exchange of views, it was agreed that the Committee would review the question of the provision of summary records to subsidiary organs of the Assembly on the basis of a detailed Secretariat report on the experience gained during the experimental period, and that the present experimental arrangements would be extended until such time as the Assembly decided otherwise.

10. One delegation stated that in principle it was opposed to the provision of summary records to all bodies so entitled by resolution 37/14 C, and that its decision not to oppose the consensus achieved by the Committee should not be taken as support for the provision of records to those bodies.

11. The Committee recommended that the General Assembly should approve the draft calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for the biennium 1986-1987 (see annex II) and recommended that the Committee should be requested to review the question of the provision of summary records to subsidiary organs of the Assembly.

B. Intersessional departures from the approved calendar for 1985

Additions to or changes in the conference programme

12. The Committee considered seven additions to or changes in the approved calendar of conferences for 1985. These were the following:

(a) Conference on the Emergency Situation in Africa. The Committee concurred in the proposed two-day conference on the understanding that it would be serviced from within existing resources;

(b) Preparatory Committee for the International Conference on the Relationship between Disarmament and Development, first session. On the basis of a report contained in document A/AC.172/104, the Committee discussed the implementation of General Assembly decision 39/424 of 17 December 1984 on the venue of the Preparatory Committee's session. The report of the Committee on Conferences is contained in document A/AC.172/105;

(c) Board of Trustees, United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture, fourth session. The Committee considered the question on the basis of document A/AC.172/104/Add.1. Its report is contained in document A/AC.172/104/Add.2;

(d) Commission on the Status of Women acting as the preparatory body for the World Conference to Review and Appraise the Achievements of the United Nations Decade for Women, resumed session. The Committee took up the matter following the adoption of General Assembly decision 39/459 of 12 April 1985 and in accordance with paragraph 3 of General Assembly resolution 39/68 A. Its report is contained in document A/AC.172/106;

(e) Advisory Board on Disarmament Studies. The Committee considered the question on the basis of document A/AC.172/108. Its report is contained in document A/AC.172/109;

(f) General Conference of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, first session. The Committee decided to authorize a one-day extension to the session at the request of the enlarged Bureau of the General Conference, which included regional group representatives;

(g) Committee on Negotiations with Intergovernmental Agencies. In the light of General Assembly resolution 34/96 of 13 December 1979 and Economic and Social Council resolution 1985/74 of 26 July 1985, the Committee on Conferences, at its 237th meeting on 30 August 1985, agreed to the holding of the meetings of the Committee during the General Assembly session.

C. Improved utilization of conference-servicing resources

1. Shortening of sessions, or a biennial cycle of sessions, of United Nations organs

13. In 1983, the Committee requested its Chairman to communicate with bodies shown by statistical reports (A/AC.172/88 and Add.1) to have failed to utilize 25 per cent or more of the resources allocated to them for each session over the previous three years in order to inform them of that fact and, in conformity with the wishes of the General Assembly, to offer consultations on adjusting the length of their sessions accordingly.

14. The correspondence resulting from this decision was examined by the Committee at its 1984 session (A/AC.172/96 and Add.1-3). At the same time, the Chairman held a series of informal meetings with some of the Chairmen with whom he had been in contact over that matter and reported thereon to the Committee.

15. On 25 March 1985, the Acting Chairman of the Committee on Conferences met with the Chairman of the Legal Sub-Committee of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space to discuss the Sub-Committee's past use of the conference-servicing resources allocated to it. The Chairman of that Sub-Committee agreed to make a statement to the Sub-Committee describing the meeting and stressing the importance of making the fullest possible use of the conference-servicing resources made available to the Sub-Committee.

16. A further meeting, between the Acting Chairman of the Committee on Conferences and the Chairman of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space, took place in June 1985. The latter subsequently made a statement to the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space, stressing the importance of punctual attendance at the Committee's meetings.

17. At its 231st meeting, on 27 August 1985, the Committee resumed discussion of this item on the basis of a Secretariat report containing statistics of bodies' meetings in New York and Geneva (A/AC.172/88/Add.3), and a number of proposals and suggestions were made.

18. One delegation proposed that the Secretary-General should be authorized to reduce the level of conference services made available to those bodies that had, over the past three years, utilized 75 per cent or less of the conference-servicing resources made available to them. Another delegation commented that the Secretary-General was not the proper authority to make such a reduction and felt that the time had not yet come for such sweeping measures.

19. In response to questions, the Secretariat explained that, while the Secretary-General could not reduce the entitlement of a body to a certain level of services, the policy of overprogramming, as approved by the Committee on Conferences and endorsed by the General Assembly, allowed the Secretariat to allocate meeting resources in such a way as to make the best use of them.

20. The point was made during further discussion that potential wastage resulted from two sources: cancellations of meetings and the late starting and early ending of meetings. Members looked forward to seeing the 1985 meetings statistics, which were still being compiled, to see if they permitted a clearer picture of the present situation.

21. It was also pointed out that, if overprogramming were to continue to be employed in order to increase the flexibility of the Secretariat, it was not necessarily desirable for bodies to make complete use of all the resources allocated to them, since overprogramming for its successful implementation required a measure of underutilization.

22. Another proposal was made to the effect that a Committee that had failed to make full use of its services in the past would be entitled to a reduced number of meetings in the future, but would be allowed to hold further meetings on an "as available" basis.

23. Other delegations felt that more time should be allowed to monitor the implementation of General Assembly resolution 39/68 B, which dealt with the improved utilization of conference-servicing resources.

24. Consideration was also given to a proposal that the Committee on Conferences should negotiate with subsidiary organs of the Assembly that had made insufficient use of their resources with a view either to reducing the level of their services or to discussing their implementation of resolution 39/68 B. It was proposed that the Committee should communicate with United Nations bodies which had over the past three years failed to utilize 75 per cent or more of the services allocated to them. Those bodies should be requested to consider whether all conference facilities allocated for 1986 were necessary. Such bodies should be given the opportunity formally to discuss their utilization of conference-servicing resources on the basis of statistics supplied by the Secretariat, and to that end they should include in their agendas an item on that matter. Any discussion that took place in those bodies under that item, and any practical steps to improve an organ's utilization of such services, could be communicated to the Committee on Conferences and reported to the Assembly.

25. At the 233rd meeting of the Committee, on 28 August 1985, discussion centred on a proposal calling on United Nations bodies to make further efforts to ensure that their requests for services corresponded accurately to their requirements, to plan their work accordingly and to report on the matter to the Assembly.

The Committee agreed on the following formulation:

"The General Assembly

"Urges all United Nations bodies to increase their efforts to ensure that their requests for conference-servicing resources correspond accurately to their requirements;

"Further urges those bodies to plan their work well in advance in order to make full use of the conference-servicing resources allocated to them and so that any unused conference-servicing resources can be reassigned to ensure their most effective utilization;

"Requests subsidiary organs of the General Assembly to include in their reports to the Assembly a statement on the progress made in response to the relevant provisions of resolution 39/68 B on the rational and efficient utilization of conference-servicing resources."

2. Planning missions undertaken in respect of meetings or conferences held away from Headquarters

26. The Committee studied a paper by the Secretariat showing the number of planning missions in 1984, their composition, destination and cost, and the criteria used for determining the need for such missions.

27. A delegation proposed that the Secretary-General should be requested to reduce the number of planning missions and to eliminate missions to those cities where United Nations facilities existed.

28. In addition, several questions were put to the Secretariat concerning the information contained in the paper on planning missions. Delegations questioned the need to send missions to cities where the United Nations had conference facilities, such as Bangkok, Rome and London. It was also observed that disparities existed between the estimated and actual costs of the missions.

29. While it was recognized that the Department of Conference Services had to be fully informed about local conditions, some members of the Committee wondered why so many staff members from other units accompanied some missions, what their duties were, and whether better co-ordination between Headquarters and United Nations offices overseas could lead to the reduction in the number of such missions in future. The number of missions performed in 1985 to date was requested, and it was asked whether missions reported, and to whom.

30. In reply, the Secretariat informed members that representatives of all substantive and servicing units involved in the conference accompanied the mission, that their duties involved liaison with local non-governmental organizations and securing office accommodation, and that the Committee's views would be conveyed to those units. Missions had been dispatched to a number of locations already in 1985, and the Committee was informed that their reports were circulated within the

Secretariat. It was stressed that the latest information about conference facilities, even in locations already visited by the United Nations, was essential in view of the changes that could occur in such facilities. The Secretariat also responded to requests for a more detailed description of Secretariat procedures for deciding on the composition of the missions.

31. An amended version of the earlier proposal was discussed, in which the Secretary-General would be requested to review the criteria governing the dispatch of missions and to consider whether it was feasible to reduce their frequency and reduce the number of participants, especially when missions were sent to cities where United Nations facilities existed.

32. Members were divided as to the purpose and scope of such a review. Some felt that it should be carried out with a view to reducing the frequency of such missions and the number of participants in them. Others pointed out that it was not the task of the Committee to realize savings, and that planning missions could help ensure the success of a meeting or conference in terms of its smooth running and efficient conduct. Still other speakers considered that a review should aim at achieving the most rational and economic use of conference-servicing resources.

33. Agreement was reached on the following formulation:

"The General Assembly

Requests the Secretary-General to review the composition and frequency of planning missions for meetings and conferences held away from Headquarters, and in particular those sent to cities where United Nations conference facilities already exist;

Further requests the Secretary-General to report to the Committee on Conferences at its next substantive session on the results of that review concerning planning missions sent in 1985 and, as far as possible, in 1986."

D. Pattern of conferences

34. By its resolution 39/68 C, the General Assembly requested the Committee on Conferences to undertake an in-depth study of all existing provisions relating to the pattern of conferences, taking into account all the modifications proposed during the thirty-eighth session of the Assembly, with a view to reporting to the Assembly at its fortieth session.

35. The Committee had originally taken up the matter in 1983, intending to update the codification of conference-servicing provisions contained in General Assembly resolution 31/140, section I, in the light of developments since that resolution's adoption in 1976.

36. In its report to the General Assembly at its thirty-eighth session, 3/ the Committee submitted a draft resolution on the pattern of conferences (draft resolution C). During the discussion of the matter in the Fifth Committee, a number of amendments to the draft resolution were proposed. In the absence of agreement on those amendments, the Assembly requested the Committee on Conferences to examine the provisions of section I of resolution 31/140 and to report to the Assembly at its thirty-ninth session.

37. In 1984, following a discussion which included contributions from interested delegations not members of the Committee on Conferences, the Committee recommended to the General Assembly the draft resolution that was later adopted as resolution 39/68 C. At its 1985 substantive session, the Committee considered an in-depth report on the pattern of conferences contained in document A/AC.172/107.

38. During informal consultations, some agreement was reached on proposals made at the thirty-eighth session. At the 229th meeting of the Committee, on 26 August 1985, the Chairman reported that, in respect of the amendment relating to the provision of interpretation services to informal consultations, the following formulation appeared to enjoy general support:

"The General Assembly

"Requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide interpretation services to informal meetings on an ad hoc basis, in accordance with established practice."

39. Following further discussion at the 229th meeting, to which the representatives of Brazil, Egypt, India and Morocco were invited, it was agreed to exclude from the Committee's draft resolution on the pattern of conferences any reference to the issuing of invitations by specialized agencies to subsidiary organs of the General Assembly.

40. It was further agreed, in the context of a discussion on the establishment by subsidiary organs of the General Assembly of standing bodies or ad hoc sessional or intersessional bodies, to retain the existing wording contained in paragraph 6 (d) of Assembly resolution 31/140, section I.

41. With regard to the proposal on the convening of special conferences, the Secretariat explained to the Committee that no official definition of such conferences existed. In practice, however, a special conference was informally considered to refer to a conference open to the participation of all Member States and involving more than one simultaneous meeting. Recent conferences on population, energy and the environment were cited as examples.

42. Such conferences represented a special burden for Member States and the Secretariat in view of the intensive preparations required and the increased workload created for planning and servicing staff. In 1968, when eight such conferences had been convened in a single year, the strain was very severe. However, it was felt that the five fields specified by the Joint Inspection Unit in its consideration of the matter (A/9795, paras. 418-455), no longer covered all the activities in which United Nations organs engaged.

43. Consequently, the Committee agreed to formulate the draft provision as follows:

"In any given year, no more than five special conferences should be convened, unless the General Assembly specifically decides otherwise."

44. At its 230th meeting, the Committee took up other proposed amendments, which were subsequently modified at the meeting. The effect of the modified proposal was to permit a more even distribution of meetings and conferences among major United Nations conference centres as specified in the medium-term plan for 1984-1989, and to allow United Nations bodies based at Headquarters and now authorized to meet at Geneva to meet at those conference centres also.

45. In explaining the proposals, their initiator stated that the United Nations conference programme was dynamic and growing, and his amendment was designed to reflect that fact and the fact that the conference programme had changed a great deal since the present pattern was laid down in the 1950s. His proposals were not new, but had already been endorsed by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the Joint Inspection Unit, whose report had recommended, inter alia, that the Assembly should allow Headquarters-based bodies then authorized to meet at Geneva to meet also at Vienna during the period 1975-1977 (see resolution 3350 (XXIX), para. 5).

46. Other delegations, however, stated that a balance had already been achieved on the basis of a pragmatic and consensual approach. There now existed, by the decision of competent United Nations bodies, a number of exceptions to the principle that United Nations bodies should meet at their respective established headquarters, and the result of the amendment under discussion would be to convert an exception into a principle. Such a permanent and general change would lead to physical and financial problems and would upset the existing stability in the conference programme and in the Secretariat establishment. No evidence had been adduced to indicate that there was a need for an increased use of other conference centres. In the view of those delegations, the amendment was unacceptable both in its original and in its modified form.

47. After further discussion, the Committee agreed to include in their draft resolution the following formulation:

"The General Assembly

"Requests the Secretary-General to ensure the most rational and effective use of all United Nations conference centres and facilities;

"Requests the Committee on Conferences to continue its periodic examination of the rules governing conference planning."

48. Later, one delegation expressed reservations about the continued validity of paragraph 4 (a) of resolution 31/140, section I, which allowed the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme to meet at the United Nations Office at Geneva, although it was based in New York. The delegation also objected to paragraph 4 (f) of that resolution, which allowed regional commissions to meet outside their headquarters, pointing out that meetings facilities at the headquarters of a number of regional commissions had recently been modernized.

49. The Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly the draft resolution contained in section I of the present report.

III. CONTROL AND LIMITATION OF DOCUMENTATION

Feasibility of instituting an abbreviated form of summary record

50. During its 1984 session, the Committee on Conferences examined abbreviated summary records, two to three pages in length, prepared on an experimental basis by the Secretariat and compared them with the original summary records on which they were based. While the abbreviated records were acceptable to some delegations, others believed that the reduced content of the abbreviated versions would not adequately reflect the proceedings. The Committee agreed that the Chairman should write to the relevant United Nations organs describing the Committee's work on that matter and requesting their views on which form of record, the summary or the experimental abbreviated summary, was more appropriate for their own purposes.

51. By paragraph 2 of its resolution 39/68 D, the General Assembly noted that the Committee on Conferences would further examine, after consulting with United Nations organs entitled to receive summary records, the relative suitability of summary records as now prepared and the abbreviated summary records prepared by the Secretariat on an experimental basis, with a view to reporting to the Assembly at its fortieth session.

52. Accordingly, in 1985, the Acting Chairman of the Committee on Conferences wrote to the Chairmen of bodies in receipt of summary records to ask for their views. Since not all those contacted had responded before the opening of the Committee's 1985 session, the Committee felt it would be in a better position to pursue the matter in 1986 when more information was forthcoming.

53. Such a course of action would also be in keeping with the biennial approach to its work adopted by the Committee at its organizational meeting in 1985. In accordance with paragraph 3 of General Assembly resolution 38/32 D, the Committee decided to concentrate on matters related to the pattern of conferences in 1985, and to devote more time to documentation questions in 1986.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECISION 34/401

54. The Committee considered a Secretariat report on the present procedures for implementing paragraph 34 of General Assembly decision 34/401, which states that no subsidiary organ of the Assembly may meet at United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly, unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly.

55. The Committee was informed that a number of requests for exceptions to that decision were received each year and that detailed substantive reasons for the requests were not normally given. Delegations did not find fault with the Committee's current procedure for dealing with such requests, but some felt that those bodies requesting exceptions to the Assembly's decision should explain the reasons for their requests in greater detail. Others, however, stated that the work of some bodies was so important that they should not be required to explain their need to meet.

56. Since some delegations opposed the idea of granting a blanket exemption from the Assembly's decision to certain bodies, it was suggested that exemptions might be considered where a body's reporting schedule or the nature of its mandate required a meeting during the Assembly session. At the same time, it was pointed out that important meetings should not be held up for bureaucratic reasons.

57. It was also stressed that all members of the Committee should have a voice in deciding whether or not exemptions should be permitted. However, it was said that in exceptional circumstances, the Chairman might have to advise the President of the General Assembly after consultations with the Bureau alone and to inform the Committee afterwards. It was debated whether "exceptional circumstances" should be taken to mean just the pressure of time or whether other considerations would apply.

58. Subsequently, upon the proposal of the Chairman, it was agreed that the Chairman of the Committee on Conferences, having received a request for such an exception to be made to paragraph 34 of General Assembly decision 34/401, preferably before the opening of the Assembly session, should circulate the request to the members of the Committee. On the basis of their replies and, if necessary, on the basis of a decision of the Committee, he would advise the President of the Assembly accordingly. The requests for exceptions should contain detailed and substantive reasons why the meeting was necessary.

59. A delegation raised the question of entities other than United Nations bodies meeting at Headquarters during General Assembly sessions, noting that such bodies were not covered by paragraph 34 of Assembly decision 34/401. Members felt that such bodies could make a valuable contribution to the work of the Organization, and the question of their meetings was a complex and delicate one. The Committee decided to examine the matter more thoroughly in 1986 on the basis of a report from the Secretariat.

V. OTHER BUSINESS

60. The Committee reviewed its procedure for implementing paragraph 6 of General Assembly resolution 35/10 A, by which the Assembly requested the Committee to examine proposals made during sessions of the Assembly which had conference-servicing implications. Members agreed to hold such review meetings before action was taken in the Main Committee of origin. It was understood that the observations of the Committee on Conferences would be conveyed both to that Main Committee and to the Fifth Committee.

VI. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

A. Terms of reference and membership

61. The General Assembly, by its resolution 32/72 of 9 December 1977, decided to retain the Committee on Conferences established under its resolution 3351 (XXIX) of 18 December 1974. The Committee's terms of reference are to be found in paragraphs 3 and 4 of resolution 32/72.

62. At its 71st plenary meeting, on 25 November 1983, the General Assembly agreed to extend the mandate of the Committee on Conferences for a further three years beginning on 1 January 1984. Subsequently, the President of the General Assembly appointed the following 22 States members of the Committee: Algeria, Austria, Bahamas, Bulgaria, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Chile, Cyprus, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, Honduras, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Mexico, Nigeria, Senegal, Sri Lanka, Tunisia, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and United States of America.

B. Officers

63. The Committee elected the following officers to serve in 1985:

Acting Chairman: Mr. Mihail Bushev (Bulgaria)

Vice-Chairmen: Mr. Fernando Danus (Chile)
Mr. Bodo H. Gaw (Germany, Federal Republic of)
Mr. Bernard Goonetilleke (Sri Lanka)

Rapporteur: Mr. Oluseye Oduyemi (Nigeria).

64. However, during the course of the year, a number of casual vacancies arose. Consequently, before the substantive session, further elections took place, with the following result:

C. Organization of work

65. The Committee agreed to meet as required to take up matters related to the calendar of conferences and its implementation, in particular the consideration of intersessional departures from the approved calendar. In previous years, the Committee has held a two-week session to discuss substantive matters. In 1985, however, in the spirit of General Assembly resolutions 38/32 D and 39/68 B on the improved utilization of conference-servicing resources, the Committee decided to

adopt a biennial approach to its work and to concentrate on matters related to the pattern of conferences and the optimum use of conference-servicing resources. It therefore decided to hold a one-week session only and met from 26 to 30 August 1985. In 1986, the Committee will concentrate on questions relating to the control and limitation of documentation.

66. The Committee also agreed to continue taking decisions by consensus, bearing in mind the substance of the items discussed and adopting a pragmatic and flexible approach in order not to impede the exercise of the Committee's functions.

D. Programme of work

67. On the basis of a note by the Secretariat, the Committee discussed its programme of work for 1985 and agreed upon an agenda for its substantive session (see A/AC.172/103 and Add.1). The Under-Secretary-General for Conference Services and Special Assignments addressed the Committee at its organizational and substantive sessions.

68. At the final meeting of the substantive session, on 30 August 1985, the Chairman paid tribute to Mr. Godofredo Figueroa, the Secretary of the Committee and Chief of the Plannings and Meetings Servicing Section, who was leaving the Organization. Mr. Figueroa had been closely associated with the work of the Committee since its inception.

69. A list of documents submitted to the Committee on Conferences by the Secretariat appears in annex I to the present report.

VII. WORK OF THE COMMITTEE DURING THE THIRTY-NINTH SESSION
OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

70. During the thirty-ninth session of the General Assembly, the Committee met seven times (215th-221st meetings) to consider information presented to it under paragraph 6 of resolution 35/10 A, in which the Committee was requested to review proposals affecting the schedule of conferences and meetings made at sessions of the Assembly when administrative implications were being considered under rule 153 of the Assembly's rules of procedure.

71. The observations of the Committee on Conferences on matters brought to its attention under this provision are presented to the Fifth Committee or the Assembly in the form of addenda to the relevant statements on programme budget implications. Below is a list of the matters discussed by the Committee under paragraph 6 of resolution 35/10 A during the thirty-ninth session, showing the symbol of the document containing the Committee's observations.
