## AGENDA ITEM 15 (continued)

ELECTIONS TO FILL VACANCIES IN PRINCIPAL ORGANS
(b) FLLECIION OF EIGHTEEN MEMBERS OF THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): The Assembly will now proceed to the election of 18 members of the Economic and Social Council ro replace those members whose term of office expires on 31 December 1985.

The 18 outgoing members are Algeria, Botswana, Bulgaria, Congo, Djibouti, Ecuador, the German Democratic Republic, Lebanon, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealana, Saudi Arabia, Sierra Leone, Suriname, Thailand and the United States of America. These 18 States are eligible for immediate re-election.

I should like to remind the Assembly that after 1 January 1986 the following States will remain as members of the Economic and Social Council: Argentina, Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Finland, France, the Federal Republic of Germany, Guinea, Guyana, Haiti, Iceland, India, Indonesia, Japan. Morocco, Nigeria, Papua New Guinea, Poland, Romania, Rwanda, Senegal, Somalia, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Turkey, Uganda, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great $\mathrm{Br} i$ tain and Northern Ireland, Venezuela, Yugoslavia, Zaire and Zimbabwe.

Those 36 States should therefore not appear on the ballot papers.
Paragraph 4 of General Assembly resolution 2847 (XXVI) of 20 December 1971, provides that the 18 members should be elected as follows: five from African States, four from Asian States, three from Latin American States, four from Western European and other States and two from the socialist States of Eastern Europe. The ballot papers take that pattern into account.

## (The President)

The candidates which receive the grestost memser cin votas and the turnitised majority required will be declared elected. In the case of a tie vote for the last seat, there will be a restricted ballot limited to those candidates which have obtained an equal number of votes.

May I take it that the General Assenbly agrees to that procedure?
It was so decided.
The PRESIDENT (interpretation Erom Spanish): In accordance with rule 92 of the rules of procedure, the election shall be held by secret ballot and there shall be no nominations.

The Assembly will recall that in the past chairmen of regional groups have been allowed to speak st thie stage to clarify the status of the candidatures.

I therefore call on the representative of the Syrian Arab Republic in his capacity as Chairman of the Asian Group.

Mr. AL-ATASSI (Syrian Arab Republic) (interpretation from Arabic): The Asian Group, at its meeting this morning, did not reach a consensus in support of candidates for the Economic and Social Council. We therefore have six candidates for the four vacant seats, namely, Iran, Irag, Pakistan, the Philippines, the Syrian Arab Republic and Viet Nam.

The PRESTDENT (interpretation from Spanish): I call on the representative of Chile to speak as Chatrman of the tacin Aberican Guop.

Mr. DAZA (Chile) (interpretation from Spanish): I wishito report to the Assembly that for the three Iatin merican vacancies there are five candidates: Jamaica, Mexico, Panama, Peru and Suriname.

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): Ballot papers marked A, B, C, $D$ and $E$ will now be distributed. I reguest represer. itives to use only those ballot papers and to write on then the names of the riewber states for wich they wish to vote in each Group.

Ballot papers containing more names than the nusber assigned to that Group will be declared invalid.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Caballero Fodriquez (Cuba) Mr. Rada (Czechoslowakia). Mr. Schnelle (Federal Republic of Germany), Mr. Al-Mohamed (Oman) and Mr. Mayira (Rwanda) acted as tellers.

The following countries, having obtained the required two-thirds majority,
were elected members of the Economic and Social Council for a period of three years beginning 1 January 1986: Australia, Belgiun, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Djibouti, Egypt, Gabon, German Democratic Republic, Irag, Italy, Mozambique, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Sierra Leone and the United States of America.

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): There remain three seats to be filled, one from the Asian Group and two from the Latin American Group. We shall therefore proceed to a second ballot restricted to the two states in the Asian Group which received the greatest number of votes in the ballet just taken, namely, the Syrian Arab Republic and Viet Nam, and to the four states in the Latin American Group which received the greatest number of votes in that ballot, namely Jamaica, Nexico, Panama and Suriname. This is consistent with rule 94 of the rules of procedure.

## (The President)


Ballot paper $B$. for the Asian Group, will be declared invalid if it contains more than one name or the name of any state other than the Syrian Arab Republic or Viet Nam. Ballot paper $C$, for the Latin American Group, will be declared invalid if it contains more than two names or the name of any State other than Jamaica, Mexico, Panama or suriname.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Caballero Rodriguez (Cuba), Mr. Rada (Czechoslovakia) Mr. Schnelle (Federal Republic of Germany). Mr. Al-Mohamed (Oman) and Mr. Mayira (Rwanda) acted as tellers.

A vote was taken by secret ballot.

The meeting was suspended at 4.55 p.n. and resured at 5.35 p.m.

The PRESIDEAT (interpretation fron Spanish): Since none of the States has obtained the required two-thirds majority, the General Assembiy sill continue the voting. In accordance with rule 94 of the rules of procenture, the ballot will be restricted to the two States in the Asian Group which received the largest number of votes in the ballot just taken, namely, the Syrian Arab Republic and viet Nam, and the four states of the Iatin American Group which received the largest number of votes in that ballot, namely, Jamaica, Hexico, Panama and Suriname.

I call on the representative of Viet Nam on point of order.
Mr. FRAM RGAC (Viet Nam): For the past three years the Socialist Republic of Viet Nan sought candidature in the Asian Group for election to the Econoaic and Social Council. We hase twice withdrawn our candidature to ensure a clean slate for that Group. In the same spirit of co-operation, the delegation of Viet Nam now withdraws its candidature in the present election and lends its support to the Syrian Arab Republic. My delegation wishes to thank most warmily those delegations which have supported our candidature and hopes that Viet Nam will enjoy their support in next year 's elections.

The PRESIDERT (interpretation from Spanish): I thank the representative of Viet Nan for his co-operation, which helps speed up our procedures. I hope that his examin will be followea by other groups.

I call on the representative of Sur aame on a point of order.
Mr. GUDA (Suriname): Suriname has served for the past two and a half years in the Economic and Social Council and, I think, has made a valid contribution. We were prepared to continue in the same spirit and the same way. If it is the wish of the General Assembly that we serve in another capacity, we shall abide by the verdict given this afternoon. It is therefore our wish to witharaw our candidature.

The PRESTDEST (interpretacion Erom Spanish): I thank the representative of Sutzname for his co-operation.

At the invitation of the Pgesident, Mr. Cabsiloro poariques (Cuba), Ex. Rada
(Czechoslovakia), Mr. Schnelie (Eederal Bepublic of Germany. Mr. Al-Mohamed (Oman) and ME. Mayta (Fyanda) acted as tellers.

The meeting was suspended at 5.45 p.m. and resumed at 6.17 p.m.

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): Before giving the result of the voting, I must apologize to the Assembly because in the previous ballot under group $B$ there was an error in calculation. Hembers who noted the figures will have realized that the figure given for the two-thirds majority was incorrect.

I will give the figures again so that the position is clear. The number of ballot papers was 156 , the number of invalid ballots 7 , the number of valid ballots 149 and abstentions 17. The number of Members voting was then given as 142 , which was not correct. The correct number of Members voting was 132. Thus the required two-thirds majority was 88 , rot 95 as stated, and the Syrian Arab Republic received 89 votes.

This does not prevent me from reiterating our gratitude to the representative of Viet Nam for his gesture.

I apologize again to the Assembly for the inexcusable, but certainly unintentional, error.

The Syrian Arab Republic having been elected in the earlier vote, the subsequent ballot to fill the post which it was thought was not yet filled has been invalidated.

Panama and the Syrian Arab Republic, having obtained the required two-thirds majority, were elected members of the Economic and Social Council for a threeyear term beginning on 1 January 1986.

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): Since one seat remains to be filled in the Latin American Group, we shall now proceed, in accordance with rule 94, to a second ballot, restricted to two States, namely, Mexico and Jamaica, which were not elected but obtained the largest number of votes in the ballot just taken.

Ballot papers will now be distributed. I ask representatives to write on the ballot paper the name of the one State for which they wish to vote. Ballot papers containing the name of any State other than Jamaica or Mexico or containing more than one name will be declared invalid.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Caballero Rodriguez (Cuba), Mr. Rada (Czechoslovakia) e Mr. Schnelle (Federal Republic of Germany), Mr. Al-Mohameã (Oman) and Mr. Mayira (Rwanda) acted as tellers.

A vote was taken by secret ballot.

## The meeting was suspended at 6.25 pom. and resumed at 6.48 p.in.

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): The result of the voting is 38 follows:

The PRESIDENT (interpretation Erom Spanish): As the result of the third restricted vote has also been inconclusive, we must, in accordance with the rules of procedure, proceed to an unrestricted ballot.

Fay I remind the Assembly that Members will have the right to vote for any of the States of the Latin American Group, except, of course, those which are already members of the Econosic and Social Council, and those just elected. For greater clarity I shall mention the names of the States for which no one should vote oa this occasion: Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Guyana, Raiti, Panama, Peru and Venezuela.

Ballot papers will now be distributed. I request Members to write the name of one State only.

I call on the representative of Mexico on a point of order.

Mr. MOYA PALENCIA (Mexico) (interpretation from Spanish: Mexico is a country which belifeves firmaly in multilateralism, and, participatescyery seriously in the work of our Organization in all its bodies and organs. Hexico has worked for some years in the Economic and Social: Council with great determination, and that is why it presented its candidature for re-election, counting on the support of an inportant segment of the international community. Hopever, to facilitate the election in this case and while we express our gratitude to all the countries that have supported us in the previous ballots, we have decided to withdraw our. candidature.

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): I thank, the representative of Hexico for his gesture, but, as I understand it, we must proceed to the vote because the rules stipulate that the vote must be secret and that a two-thirds majority is required. In an unrestricted ballot, Members have the right to vote for any State fros the Latin American Group except, of course, those I have just Iisted.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Caballero Rodriguez (Cuba), Mr. Rada (Czechoslovakia), Mr. Schnelle (Federai Fepuioic of (iermany), Mr. Al-Mohamed (Oman) and Mr. Mayira (Rwanda) acted as tellers.

A vote was taken by secret ballot.
