MINISTERIAL DECISION NO. 3, 1988, TO AMEND CERTAIN SCHEDULES ANNEXED TO LAW NO. 9, 1987, FOR THE CONTROL OF NARCOTIC DRUGS AND DANGEROUS PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES AND THE REGULATION OF THEIR USE AND TRADE THEREIN

The Minister of Public Health,

Considering the Provisional Constitution, as amended, and in particular article 34 thereof,

Considering also Law No. 5, to prescribe the powers of the ministers and define the spheres of competence of the ministries and other government bodies and the legislative amendments thereto,

Considering also Law No. 9, 1987, $\underline{1}$ / to control narcotic drugs and dangerous psychotropic substances and to regulate their use and trade therein, and in particular article 33 thereof,

Considering also Decree No. 61, 1986, approving the accession of the State of Qatar to the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol,

Considering also Decree No. 2, 1987, approving the accession of the State of Qatar to the Convention on Psychotropic Substances, 1971,

Considering also the decision taken by the Council of Ministers at its tenth regular session in 1987 held on 18 March 1987, by which it approved the membership of the State of Qatar in the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the United Nations Economic and Social Council,

Taking account of the amendments made by the Commission on Narcotic Drugs to the lists of dangerous substances in the Schedules annexed to the Convention on Psychotropic Substances,

And in accordance with the adoption by the Council of Ministers of the draft decision at its sixth regular session in 1988 held on 17 February 1988,

Has decided the following:

<u>Article l</u>

Schedules 1(b) entitled "dangerous psychotropic substances", 2 and 3, annexed to Law No. 9 of 1987, to control narcotic drugs and dangerous psychotropic substances and to regulate their use and trade therein, shall be amended as follows:

First:

The following substances with their designated serial numbers shall be added to Schedule No. 1(b) under the heading of "dangerous psychotropic substances":

Fourth:

(6) Preparations of Dextropropoxyphene for oral use when compounded with one or more active ingredients and containing not more than 65 mg of Dextropropaxphene base per dosage unit provided that such preparations do not contain any psychotropic substances.

Article 2

Any other provision inconsistent with the provisions of this decision shall be repealed.

<u>Article 3</u>

All the authorities concerned, each within its respective sphere of competence, shall implement this decision, which shall enter into force on the day on which it is published in the <u>Official Gazette</u>.
