Letter dated 30 September 1985 from the Permanent
Representative of Pakistan to the United Nations
addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter of 13 September 1985 (A/40/639-S/17465), I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Pakistan has rejected as false and baseless the allegations made by the Kabul authorities that, on 6, 7 and 8 September 1985, Pakistan Militia personnel had entered Afghanistan and attacked areas south of Khost. Pakistan's rejection of the allegations was conveyed to the Afghan Chargé d'affaires in Islamabad on 17 and 24 September 1985. He was told to convey to the authorities in Kabul that they should desist from making such fabricated charges, which only reflected an attempt by them to shift the blame on to Pakistan for events within Afghanistan.

I request Your Excellency to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 28, and of the Security Council.
