PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1990-1991

Work-load standards for various categories of conference-servicing staff, including clerical and typing staff, and work-load statistics for the various conference services in the 1986-1987 and 1988-1989 bienniums

United States of America: draft decision

The General Assembly,

Having considered the report of the Secretary-General on work-load standards for conference-servicing staff 1/ and the related recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 2/

1. Takes note of the Secretary-General's revised work-load standards, as modified by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;
2. Also notes that the revised work-load standards reflect a further step towards enhanced productivity of conference-servicing staff, including improvements achieved through the application of new technologies;
3. Urges the Secretary-General and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions to keep these standards under review in order further to enhance economy and efficiency in conference-servicing activities;
4. Requests the Secretary-General to pursue through the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination the elaboration of unified work-load standards for

conference-servicing staff within the United Nations common system and to report thereon, through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, to the General Assembly at its forty-seventh session;

5. Requests the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions to review with the United Nations organizations during this time the efforts being undertaken to achieve the harmonization of work-load standards in conference-servicing of all United Nations organizations;

6. Requests the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its forty-seventh session, through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, on progress relating to the further development of work-load standards in conference-servicing for all United Nations conference facilities, including those of the regional commissions.
