Report of the Fifth Committee

- 1. At its 21st and 23rd meetings, on 5 and 6 November 1990, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/45/25 and Corr.1) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/45/L.3. The Fifth Committee had before it the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Ouestions (A/45/7/Add.4).
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/45/SR.21 and 23).
- 3. Following the decision of the Committee, the representative of Afghanistan made a statement.

## DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

4. Based on the statement by the Secretary-General on the programme budget implications and on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, the Fifth Committee decided, without a vote, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/45/L.3, an additional appropriation of \$6,150,000 would be required under section 1 (Overall policy-making, direction and co-ordination) of the programme budget for the

biennium 1990-1991. Furthermore, these additional requirements should be provided without recourse to the contingency fund. In addition, an additional appropriation of \$336,100 would be required under section 31 (Staff assessment), offset by the same amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).
