# Protest note dated 1 October 1985 from the Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs of Nicaragua to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Honduras

I am writing to you with reference to the serious events outlined below:

On 17 September 1985 a mercenary force originating in Honduras infiltrated into Nicaragua in the area adjacent to La Chamuscada hill and proceeded to attack sectors 1 and 2 in El Nancital district, in San Francisco del Norte, El Pavón and Las Lajitas districts, in Cinco Pinos, and Paso Hondo district, in Santo Tomás in the Department of Chinandega.

As a result of these terrorist acts, the mercenaries abducted 27 civilians who were taken into Honduran territory. Since then, 10 of the persons abducted have managed to escape and inform the Nicaraguan authorities of what happened and of the names of the following Nicaraguan citizens who are still held captive in Honduras:

The Government of Nicaraqua formally denounces these acts of terrorism and requests the immediate co-operation of the Honduran authorities to protect the right to physical integrity and life of the abducted Nicaraquans and to obtain their repatriation to Nicaraqua. Furthermore, the Government of Nicaraqua once again protests in the strongest and most categorical terms against the use of Honduran territory as a base for attacks on Nicaraqua. These events once again indicate the need for the establishment of a joint border patrol between the two countries in order to eliminate once and for all the causes of tension and, in that way, contribute to the peace process promoted by the nations of the Contadora Group.
