## THE RIGHT OF PEOPLES TO SELF-DETERMINATION AND ITS APPLICATION TO PEOPLES UNDER COLONIAL OR ALIEN DOMINATION OR FOREIGN OCCUPATION

## Report of the Secretary-General

1. At its forty-sixth session the Commission on Human Rights adopted resolution 1990/6, entitled "Situation in occupied Palestine". By this resolution, the Commission <u>inter alia</u> called upon Israel to comply with its obligations under the Charter of the United Nations and to withdraw from the Palestinian and Other Arab territories which it had occupied since 1967. It requested the Secretary-General to transmit the resolution to the Government of Israel with a view to its implementation, to report thereon to the Commission at its forty-seventh session, and to make available to the Commission, prior to the convening of its forty-seventh session, all information pertaining to the implementation of the resolution.

2. In accordance with this request, the Secretary-General on 14 June 1990 addressed a note verbale to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the State of Israel requesting information on the measures taken or envisaged by his Government in implementation of this resolution.

3. No reply had been received at the time of the preparation of the present report.
