<u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development to prepare a comprehensive analytical study on the present situation and future trends regarding the relation between environmental issues and international trade, reflecting, <u>inter alia</u>, the perspective that environmental concerns should not be used to introduce new forms of conditionality and should not serve as a pretext for creating unjustified barriers to trade; the report should cover trade and the transfer of environmentally sound technologies, as well as the appearance of non-tariff trade barriers resulting from environmental concerns and the impact of such barriers on the economic development of developing countries.
