LETTER DATED 21 DECEMBER 1990 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

By resolution 669 (1990), adopted by the Security Council at its 2942nd meeting on 24 September 1990, the Council, recalling its resolution 661 (1990) of 6 August 1990, entrusted the Security Council Committee established by resolution 661 (1990) concerning the situation between Iraq and Kuwait with the task of examining requests for assistance under the provisions of Article 50 of the Charter of the United Nations, and making recommendations to the President of the Security Council for appropriate action.

By letters dated 19 and 21 December 1990 (S/22021 and Add.1), respectively, the Chairman of the Committee transmitted the recommendations of the Committee with regard to the following 18 States: Bulgaria, Tunisia, Romania, India, Yugoslavia, Lebanon, the Philippines, Sri Lanka, Yemen, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Mauritania, Pakistan, the Sudan, Uruguay, Viet Nam, Bangladesh and the Seychelles.

At consultations of the whole of the Security Council held on 20 December 1990, it was decided to inform you of the above-mentioned recommendations of the Security Council Committee established by resolution 661 (1990) concerning the situation between Iraq and Kuwait pursuant to resolution 669 (1990) in connection with requests for assistance under the provisions of Article 50 of the Charter of the United Nations and to request you to implement the actions contained in the recommendations.
