Statement issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs
on 15 February 1991

The Tunisian Government has learned with satisfaction that Iraq announced today that it was prepared to cooperate with a view to the implementation of Security Council resolution 660 (1990).

The Tunisian Government, which has worked ceaselessly for the application of international law and the peaceful settlement of the Gulf crisis, and which has called for Iraq's withdrawal and the preservation of the potential and achievements of the Iraqi people which are in danger of destruction and devastation, hopes that this positive initiative by Iraq will prompt a reaction which, by means of a halt to the fighting and a cessation of the conflict, will be able to put an end to this terrible tragedy and to arrive at a just and lasting settlement of all the region's problems, without which, it believes, the security and stability of the region cannot be assured.

The Tunisian Government strongly favours dialogue and peace and hopes sincerely that all the parties to the conflict will seize this opportunity to respond to the whole world's desire for security, stability and peace.
