## SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/13737 of 11 January 1980.

During the week ending 19 January 1980, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Letter dated 22 December 1979 from the Permanent Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (see S/13033/Add.51, S/13737 and S/13737/Add.1)

The Security Council continued its consideration of the item at its resumed 2191st meeting (S/PV.2191/Add.1) on 13 January 1980.

The Council voted on the draft resolution contained in document S/13735, which received 10 votes in favour, 2 against (German Democratic Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) and 2 abstentions (Bangladesh, Mexico), and was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Security Council. One member (China) did not participate in the voting.
