NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At its 100th plenary meeting on 12 December 1979, the General Assembly adopted resolution 34/92 G,* entitled "Question of Namibia". In paragraphs 23 and 24 of that resolution, the General Assembly

"23. Calls upon the Security Council to act decisively against any dilatory manoeuvres and fraudulent schemes of the illegal occupation régime aimed at frustrating the legitimate aspirations of the Namibian people, under the leadership of the South West Africa People's Organization, self-determination and national liberation as well as negating the achievements of their just struggle;

"24. Solemnly calls once again upon the Security Council to convene urgently to impose comprehensive and mandatory sanctions against South Africa, as provided for under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, in order to ensure South Africa's immediate compliance with the resolutions and decisions of the United Nations relating to Namibia."
