NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 69th plenary meeting of its thirty-fourth session, on 15 November 1979, the General Assembly adopted resolution 34/24, entitled "Implementation of the Programme for the Decade for Action to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination".\* Paragraph 4 of the annex, entitled "Programme of activities to be undertaken during the second half of the Decade for Action to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination", reads as follows:

"The Security Council is requested to consider urgently the possibility of imposing complete and mandatory sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations against the apartheid régime of South Africa and the racist régimes of southern Africa, and in particular:

"(a) The cessation of all collaboration with South Africa in the nuclear field;

"(b) The prohibition of all technological assistance or collaboration in the manufacture of arms and military supplies in South Africa;

"(c) The prohibition of all loans to, and all investments in, South Africa and the cessation of all promotion of trade with South Africa;

"(d) An embargo on the supply of petroleum, petroleum products and other strategic commodities to South Africa."
