NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 69th plenary meeting of its thirty-fourth session, on 15 November 1979, the General Assembly adopted resolution 34/24, entitled "Implementation of the Programme for the Decade for Action to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination".* Paragraph 4 of the annex, entitled "Programme of activities to be undertaken during the second half of the Decade for Action to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination", reads as follows:

"The Security Council is requested to consider urgently the possibility of imposing complete and mandatory sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations against the <u>apartheid</u> régime of South Africa and the racist régimes of southern Africa, and in particular:

"(<u>a</u>) The cessation of all collaboration with South Africa in the nuclear field;

"(b) The prohibition of all technological assistance or collaboration in the manufacture of arms and military supplies in South Africa;

"(c) The prohibition of all loans to, and all investments in, South Africa and the cessation of all promotion of trade with South Africa;

"(d) An embargo on the supply of petroleum, petroleum products and other strategic commodities to South Africa."
