TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Federal Government's statement on the Gulf crisis

The Federal Government welcomes the announcement by President Bush of the suspension of fighting in the Gulf, following Iraq's unconditional acceptance of all the United Nations resolutions. Nigeria believes this will lead to a speedy arrangement of a permanent cease-fire and an end to the conflict.

Nigeria is further convinced that this offers opportunity for the international community to address itself to the issue of bringing a durable peace to the Middle East.

In the attainment of this objective, Nigeria stands ready to assist the United Nations in ensuring peace and security in that region.
