Report of the Fifth Committee

- 1. At its 59th meeting, on 11 December 1985, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/40/66) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution VIII recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 29 of its report (A/40/1008). The related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/40/SR.59).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 86 to 13, with 3 abstentions, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution VIII recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 29 of its report (A/40/1008), an additional appropriation of \$191,100 would be required under section 27 (Public information) of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1986-1987. An additional appropriation of \$45,500 would also be required under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an increase of the same magnitude in the estimates of income under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).

Abstaining: Italy, Japan, Portugal.
