POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT OF SOUTH AFRICA

Letter dated 10 April 1991 from the Permanent Representative of Lesotho to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Lesotho has agreed that Radio Lesotho should resume broadcasting programmes provided by the United Nations anti-apartheid radio to the extent that relations between Lesotho and South Africa are not unnecessarily harmed.

The decision is a sequel to the specific recommendations included in section VII, paragraph 30 (b), of your report dated 13 March 1990, entitled "A study of existing and potential interest in broadcasting United Nations anti-apartheid radio programmes and the extent to which audiences in selected urban centres in South Africa listen to them" (A/45/162).

I should be grateful if you would have the present letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 34.
