Please find enclosed the text */ of the message addressed to you by
His Excellency Dr. Esmat Abdel Meguid, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Arab
Republic of Egypt, concerning the recent arbitrary measures taken by the Libyan
authorities against Egyptian workers and nationals in violation of human rights,
economic and social rights and international law and conventions.

I would be obliged if you would circulate that text as an official document
under items 6 and 7 of the agenda of the Sub-Commission on Prevention of
Discrimination and Protection of Minorities and under item 12 of the draft
provisional agenda of the Commission on Human Rights, so that the series of
violations committed by the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya can be brought to the attention
of the international community.
