LETTER DATED 4 MAY 1991 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF IRAQ TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE
SECRETARY-GENERAL

On instructions from my Government, and further to our previous letters, the latest being letter No. 79 of 2 May 1991, I have the honour to convey to you the following new facts concerning Iranian actions in violation of the provisions of the cease-fire agreement between Iraq and Iran.

1. On 19 March 1991, the Administrative Officer of the city of Sardasht entered the Raniya border zone.
2. On 20 March 1991, a cartographer from Teheran called Behruz Hashempur entered by way of the Hajj Umran-Shahidan road together with five soldiers of the 64th Division.
3. On 22 March 1991, a vehicle belonging to the Ramadan intelligence centre driven by the Iranian Yadullah Abdullah from the Ramadan centre entered the Shahidan area together with five soldiers.
4. On 25 April 1991, a detachment of the Khomeini Guard entered the Darband-Baylulah area in the Khanaqin sector in order to gather information on the area.
5. Thirty elements belonging to the Khomeini Guard entered from the Bamu area in order to reconnoitre the site of the bridge located in the area of the Maydan-Khanaqin sector.

These fresh violations, which are additional to the previous Iranian violations of the provisions of the cease-fire between the two countries, once again confirm the persistence of the Iranian Government in its continuing endeavour to encroach upon the sovereignty and security of Iraq and in its blatant attempts to interfere in Iraq's internal affairs.

As it has done on previous occasions, the Government of my country affirms that the Iranian Government is liable for all the damage being caused

by these violations. In informing you of these violations, I request you to adopt such measures as are required by the principles and provisions of the United Nations Charter in order to bring them to an end.

I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
