LETTER DATED 10 MAY 1991 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF IRAQ TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

On instructions from my Government and further to our previous letters, the latest being our letter No. 95 of 9 May 1991, I have the honour to communicate to you new evidence of Iranian violations of the cease-fire between Iraq and Iran, as follows:

- 1. At 0300 hours on 4 April 1991, an armed group of Iranians infiltrated into Iraqi territory in the central sector of Iraq and blew up an army camp at Qal'at Hasinah.
- 2. At 1530 hours on 8 May 1991, four Iranian soldiers were observed digging a shelter near boundary marker No. 50, directly on the international boundary line, in the central sector of Iraq.
- 3. On 9 May 1991 an Iranian helicopter was observed flying at medium altitude opposite the forward perimeter of the Iraqi units in the central sector. Its flight path was between the areas of Naft-e Shah and Khrosrowvi along the international boundary line.
- 4. On 9 May 1991, a group of an estimated 15 persons was observed building a position directly on the international boundary line on the slope of Mount Mimak in the central sector. At the same time, another group of persons was observed building a combat position close to boundary marker No. 93, directly on the international boundary line, in the same sector.

These fresh violations, which are to be added to the list of previous Iranian violations of the provisions of the cease-fire between Iraq and Iran, once again confirm the persistence of the Iranian Government in its deliberate endeavour to encroach upon the sovereignty and security of Iraq.

The Government of my country repeats its assertion that the Iranian Government is liable for all the damage being caused by these violations.
