MESSAGE TO THE UNITED NATIONS COMMISSION
ON HUMAN RIGHTS

Geneva

The Central Committee of the Trade Union of Workers in Culture and Education of the Mongolian People's Republic expresses, on behalf of its members, class solidarity with the teachers, professors and trade-union activists of Uruguay fighting for freedom, democracy and human rights, and resolutely calls upon the Uruguayan Government immediately to restore fundamental human rights, release all political prisoners, including trade union workers, provide detailed information about missing persons and strictly observe the ILO Convention concerning Freedom of Association and Protection of the Right to Organize.

We are convinced that an international organization as qualified as the Commission on Human Rights will vigorously pursue its efforts to assist the Uruguayan people, particularly its teachers, educators and students, in their struggle for the restoration of trade union rights and democratic freedoms.
