Letter dated 22 May 1991 from the Permanent Representative of Germany to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

With reference to your meeting with Vice-Chancellor and Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Gonscher on 9 May 1991, I would like to reiterate on behalf of my Government the invitation extended on that occasion by Foreign Minister Genscher to hold the 1993 United Nations World Conference on Human Rights at Berlin.

The World Conference on Human Rights at Berlin in 1993 would be not only the first major United Nations conference to be held in Germany, but also the very first United Nations conference in the formerly divided city. Berlin, with its convention and communications facilities, hotels and cultural institutions, is in a position to provide all the necessary infrastructure to organize such an important international conference.

Germany would consider it an honour to host the World Conference.
